BEST KEPT VILLAGE COMPETITION - JUDGES COMMENTS

Lympstone is a delightful village which, at its centre, retains the air of the fishing village it used to be. It has a diverse range of private and public buildings which reflect its development over time. Judges felt it is vibrant village where many residents take a pride in their surroundings and where the Parish Council is active in leadership and works to maintain and enhance the amenities on behalf of the community. Generally there was very little litter – just odd bits on some road verges and in several public areas cigarette butts. There were examples of attractive flower beds on verges, which were well maintained and the floral arrangements in front of most of the very old cottages by the river are a delight to see.

The old cottages, Victorian buildings, estates of houses and bungalows and on the hill some ultra- modern styles, all blend in well. Private dwellings were maintained to a good standard

throughout the village.

Many gardens were well planted and colourful. Fences, walls and hedges were in good order. The allotments looked well managed and productive.

The Village Hall is a functional and well utilised building. It looked well maintained inside and out. The Scout Hall looks well used and is a useful facility. Paint might brighten it up. The public toilets were very clean and had soap and hand dryers, although there was a broken toilet seat in the ladies toilet. The central car park was tidy and well laid out, with some shrub plantings, which were reasonably tidy. The two phone kiosks found were in need of a clean and inside had litter. The open spaces in Lympstone are maintained very well - the area around the village hall and car park, the tennis courts with Club information displayed and the beautiful Candy's Field.

Maintenance work on trees in the field had been undertaken in the spring. The sports field grass was well mown. A strim around the play area fence was needed and some minor repairs to the fence and gate catches. There is a good picnic table here and also boards, indicating the play areas are monitored by an “Amenities Champion”; giving contact details. The Perspex shelter roof needs dead leaves cleared and a clean. The uprights need paint. The school yard looked tidy and well kept, with children playing happily. The new buildings blend well. Judges noted the popularity of the Exe Estuary Trail. There was a steady flow of cyclists, many of who seemed to be residents, coming and going with shopping or out for some exercise around the village or on the trail, as well as others looking more “sporty” coming off the trail at the station. On the days we visited this area seemed very orderly, regarding cyclists. The station has well-kept planters and was tidy. The border along the entrance was quite overgrown with brambles – not intrusive.

There is a very good Parish Council Notice Board near the school. This was in good condition and well laid out, giving a list of responsibilities



delegated to Councillors. All information has the Lympstone PC crest. It was interesting to see that the council has a protocol for the posting of flyers, so seeks to manage information present on lamp posts. Information was up to date but judges felt the old pins and rusty staples remaining in abundance, looked ugly. There are many boards for public notices under the railway arches, which showed all the current events, so that in all, it would be difficult for residents not to know what is happening in Lympstone over the summer.

The shops, café, pubs and restaurants dotted around the village looked very attractive. All seen, were maintained to a high standard and there were planters to add colour and interest. The nursery near the school looked good and had strong plants on show. It looked as if businesses are trying their best to serve Lympstone well. These must be great assets for residents as well as attractions for visitors to the village.

The churchyard is very well cared for and has good seating. The gate needs painting and the compost area could do with screening. Attractive and comfortable seating in the meeting area of the church and a well-equipped children's corner shows that the church is well loved and reaches out to the community. The War Memorial looked superb and well renovated. Poppies had been planted by the children in

memory of those who died in WW1. The new cemetery adjacent to the Village Hall is very well kept. The two chapels in the old centre had tidy surrounds but the planter in one looked neglected. .

Communication is very good in Lympstone. The website has good information. The map was excellent for guiding the judges. The profile was very useful. The Parish Magazine was informative about events and village groups. There is a range of groups for young people and older residents; offering a good variety activities. There are obviously many people who volunteer; running groups; the church; keeping the station clean, tidy and planted. Clearly many activities were planned to mark the centenary of WW1.

Lympstone is a lived in and thriving place. The community has clearly got behind entry to the Best Kept Village Competition. Public buildings, open spaces, commercial buildings and initiatives to sustain the overall environment scored well. Points were lost for areas requiring maintenance. The standard of villages in the New Entry category was very high this year. We are pleased to announce that Lympstone is awarded Runner Up in the BKV New Entry category in 2014. We hope that Lympstone will be proud of this accolade, as it clearly shows itself as a village with a good community spirit and where the

residents are doing their best with what they have.

Lympstone has achieved second place in the competition for which we will receive a certificate.

The judges were very impressed with our entry and complemented the village on its general appearance, in particular care and attention to front gardens and public spaces. They commented on the good communication by means of the Herald, website and posters, also the range and quality of village activities. The church and the village hall had a very positive report. We lost points on lack of maintenance on some public buildings (including the pins in the telegraph poles!) and the state of the telephone boxes.

In conclusion this was a successful exercise in raising awareness of our environment and the need to care for our parish.

I offer my sincere thanks to all those who made a special effort to support the entry.

EXE ESTUARY TRAIL-OFF ROAD ROUTE RECOMMENDED



The Devon Countryside Access Forum, who have a statutory role in advising DCC on footpaths and rights of way, have recommended to DCC that Lympstone have an alternative off road route for the Exe Estuary Trail. They are to discuss this with DCC at their meeting on 7th October 2014. They have also made some suggestions to DCC about how safety might be improved in the interim by speed restrictions and sleeping policemen etc although they recognise that these measures will not make Sowden Lane and The Strand suitable for a major cyclist route.

DCC is still to respond to the Parish Council with their proposals about safety improvements.

There continue to be a number of accidents and near misses involving cyclists on the Trail through Lympstone although many do not get recorded. In the book at the Newsagents there were 2 incidents recorded during August; a near collision between cyclists and a car at the bend by the estuary on Sowden Lane- a cyclist fell off her bike in front of the car as a result of an emergency stop on the bend and leaves on the road making it slippery. In the other incident a cyclist ran into the back of a pedestrian, the cyclist, a child, was on the wrong side of the road, the person run into was left bruised.

Information about such incidents are vitally important to support the case for an off road route - If you cannot get to the Newsagent to do this you can email me or text me with details if that is easier. judith_carter@hotmail.com or 07855 908785.

POLICE REPORT



Between the 1st and 6th July an attempted theft took place on Strawberry Hill. A padlock was damaged on a boat trailer. The offender left empty handed. Police have received a report of a man under the influence of alcohol approaching two residents and being verbally abusive, the incident caused considerable distress to the residents. This occurred between 2200 -2240hrs on Wednesday the 9th July 2014 on Candys Field. The man was described as being between 45 - 50 years of age, around 5'7 - 8" tall, wearing blue jeans, a black T shirt and a blue denim jacket. If you were in this area on this date, between these times and witnessed this incident, could offer any information, or are able to help identify this man, please contact our 101 no. quoting crime ref 090878/14.

Once again can I please remind residents to avoid parking around junctions and not to block dropped kerbs and pavements. I am aware that parking is an issue in the village and I do try to work with residents on this matter. Please be mindful when parking and take this into consideration.

The Neighbourhood Police team carried out a property marking event at the sailing club in July. This was a chance for owners to have boat engines and other equipment property marked for free. Due to the success of the event, we will be looking to carry out a

HARBOUR CRANING

FLOODING



South West Water are carrying out works to the pumping station on The Green. There will be some minor disruption and extra parking in the area but this should be minimal.

The Environment Agency is proposing to carry out essential public health and safety repairs to the footbridge (NGR: SX 99020 84085) at Underhill car park on the Wotton Brook.

The works will consist of the demolition the approach ramps on the north and south side of the defences. They will then be reconstructed on a like-for-like basis, however, they are considering changing the appearance of the parapet hand-railing to something more sympathetic to the surroundings.

They hope to resolve the issue of flood water leaking through the wall during high flows adjacent to Brookside Cottages.

They are also intending to carry out improvements to the trash screen at The Strand. The proposal is to increase the screen area and to enlarge the spacing between the bars to allow smaller debris to pass through and to prevent blinding of the screen, thus providing greater conveyance during flood events. The works have been programmed to avoid the 'tourist season' and to follow on from other works to the floodwall and gate at Quay Lane.

The works at Quay Lane entail reconstruction of part of the floodwall and the re-alignment the floodgate, both of which were damaged in the storms of February 2014. The repairs are necessary, however, they do not comprise the standard of protection in the meantime. It is envisaged these works could take between 8-9 weeks to complete.

The Environment Agency have also carried out some works in Longmeadow Road and found more problems with pipework. This should be well underway or complete by the time you read this article.

LYMPSTONE WINS AGAIN



Our Green Wedge is safe again – for the time being. Strategic Land Partnerships have withdrawn their appeal and the Inquiry scheduled for 7th and 8th October has therefore been cancelled. SLP were objecting to East Devon District Council's rejection of their proposal to build 33 houses on the land at Courtlands Cross. This followed their previous attempt to build over 150 houses on the site – in 2012 the Government Planning Inspector ruled that 'this land is unsuitable for housing'.

We will contact SLP to try to find out more about their reasons for withdrawing the application at this late stage. In their e-mail to the Planning Inspectorate they mention the weight attached to the Neighbourhood Plan, which provides for a gradual and proportionate expansion of housing in Lymington to meet local needs without eroding our village identity.

They don't mention the strength of local opposition and the fact that the Inspector could not fail to be influenced by the nearly 600 letters of opposition from Lymingtonians and visitors to the Parish.

Everyone who wrote contributed to SLP's withdrawal and this demonstrates once again how organised local opposition can thwart unwanted development. Special thanks must go to Cllr Rob Longhurst and his team, Judith Carter and everyone who helped with the 'Letters Under the Bridge' sessions, and all those who distributed fliers around the Parish.

We hope we can now enter into constructive negotiations with Strategic Land Partnerships regarding the future of the Green Wedge. Concerns still exist about the detrimental impact of their land policies on local flooding and the East Devon Way.

Whilst the proposal to build at Courtlands will not go ahead this time, there may be other battles ahead. With the continuing delays in the East Devon Local Plan no part of the parish is safe from unwanted development. There are plans to set up a parish wide 'neighbourhood forum' to build on the momentum gained from the Courtlands issue to protect our parish identity now and in the future. NEWS UPDATE - BANK HOAX CALLS

News reports this week mention an elderly gentleman from North Devon who was duped into parting with his life savings of £9,000. He received a telephone call apparently from the 'Metropolitan Police' who said his grandson had been arrested and needed money for bail. The gentleman gave his bank details to the caller which turned out to be a hoax call and his bank account was emptied. Other scams which are growing in number are calls coming from somebody claiming to be from your bank or the Police. They give a variety of reasons for calling including the fact that somebody has been arrested in possession of your bank cards and they need the account and PIN numbers from you to check this and again bank accounts are drained of funds. Other scams are used which encourage you to hang up and call your bank to verify the caller and they give you the number to call or even suggest you call 999. But because they never hang up the phone from their end, when you think you have ended the call and dial the number they ask you to call, they are in fact still on the line and they then pretend to be the person you are calling and of course verify the original call and ask you for your account and PIN numbers.



Remember, nobody, including the bank and the police, will ever call you and ask for your bank account details and PIN numbers over the telephone and you should never trust anybody making these kind of calls to you. They will also never ask you to draw any money out to 'test your account' and send it to them or send a courier round for your bank cards. All these approaches are being made - if in doubt, don't do it!
