NEWS FROM THE PARISH COUNCIL

Neighbourhood Plan

The Parish Council and the Neighbourhood Plan group all thought this was going well. It is with EDDC for its second round of formal consultation.

Unfortunately it seems that the EDDC Planners became the biggest objectors this time round even though they were consulted some months ago.

So the Parish Council and the Working Group have to meet with them to discuss a number of points that they would like to change.

That was frustrating but straight forward enough. Until the Local Plan Inspector looked at the EDDC Local Plan and unceremoniously kicked it out.

He said that it was flawed, some of the data used to justify housing numbers was so far out of date that it was worthless and the processes used to

THE justify housing policies were also flawed.

This is bad news for EDDC and is a poor reflection on those planning staff who now have the temerity to criticise our Neighbourhood Plan.

District Councillor Ben Ingham feels that it is likely to take EDDC at least two years to come up with an alternative Local Plan and this could potentially delay the Neighbourhood Plan for the same period.

The Parish Council and the Working group will now give some deep thought as to how to move forward.

Flooding

Winter is over but that does not mean that the possibility of flooding has gone away nor the urgent need to tackle the problem areas in the Parish.

Hugo Swire MP has visited the village but only had time to hear about the problems at Pretty Corner. The Parish Council has made sure that he is aware of all of the other problem areas.

Parish Council Chairman, Cllr Richard Eastley and Clerk, Tony Le Riche met with people from Devon Highways, South West Water, the Environment Agency and EDDC to discuss all of these problem areas.

All of these Agencies are aware of the work that needs doing but they do not have any funds. Each one needs to draw up schemes of work and then submit these to Regional Agencies as a bid for money to carry out the work.

The Environment Agency have a scheme to rebuild the walls to the Wotton Brook where it flows alongside the Underhill car park. They also propose replacing the screen with two screens and possible raise the level of Chapel Road. They also propose repairs to the sea wall and flood gates which were damaged during the storms.

South West Water admit that they cannot solve the sewerage problems as many of the drains in the Village are combined drains so they take rainwater and foul water. They do propose

renewing the return valves at the sewage inlet. this also takes the surface water and so it should eliminate some of the foul smells that have occurred.

DCC are fully aware of the need to deal with the drainage issues at Pretty Corner and to re-surface Longmeadow Road. Again, they have no funds for this.

It is frustrating and annoying for those who are unfortunate enough to be affected by flooding or even the fear of flooding. Every time we hear the Chancellor saying that we need to cut the deficit of the nation and reduce public spending we will now understand why there is no money for these essential infrastructure works Devon MP's have met the chancellor to emphasise to him that enough is enough but so far we have seen little change in the policy of funding local agencies so that they can carry out their work effectively.

New Financial Year – New money.

All is not lost on the financial front. The Parish Council has secured a grant from the Parishes Together Fund which uses funds provided by DCC and EDDC. The money is to surface the new path from School Hill to Candy's Field with tarmac. This will make it safer and more usable for children and mothers with pushchairs etc. There is still a will to surface the very poor area from the School gates to the new footpath. The cost of this is being assessed. The Clerk is putting together an application for funds to provide new lighting to the extension car park at the village hall to make it feel safer to use during the dark mornings and evenings. He is also preparing a bid for funds to refresh the War

Memorial so that it will stand again as a shining beacon to those who gave their lives in WWI and subsequent conflicts.



The Parish Council also has a new budget. Your Council tax for Parish Council purposes should be about 3p less for the year. Not much but at the same time it does mean that the Parish Council has funds to spend to help and improve the local area. One way that we do this is to give grants to local groups to help them along. At its meeting on 3rd March, the Parish Council heard that there was a small amount left in its grants budget for the year and so it awarded a grant of £100 to the Lympstone Third Age Project. This is a very worth while group that provide activities and refreshments for the those in their Third Age in our community. ROYAL MARINES SPEED MARCH THROUGH EXMOUTH TOWN CENTRE

On Saturday 31st May 2014 all military personnel from Commando Training Centre Royal Marines will speed march through the centre of Exmouth and Lympstone village as part of The Corps 350th birthday celebrations!

Speed marching is a mixture of running and walking which is normally done at a pace of one mile every ten minutes. Over 800 hundred Royal Marines, army and Royal Navy staff will speed march from Exmouth seafront to their base at Lympstone.

They will accompany six Royal Marines who are on the 1664 Challenge, a marathon fundraising trip around Europe to raise money for the Royal Marines Charitable Trust Fund.

The six marines have skied the length of Norway, sailed by yacht to Gibraltar, then cycled through Spain and France before canoeing across the channel and on Saturday May 31st they will come through Exmouth and Lympstone



village on the run phase of their epic journey. In Exmouth the 1664 Challenge runners will be led by Drummers from the Royal Marines Band, Standard Bearers from the Royal Marines Association and the Royal Marines Volunteer Cadet Corps.

From 10.45 am the runners will pass along the Seafront, then through Alexandra Terrace and Rolle Street to the Exmouth Strand at 11.00 am. The speed march will then move via Exeter Road onto the Estuary Trail next to the rail line.



Brief road closures will be in place throughout the event.

They will approach Lympstone no earlier than 11.20 am. The troops will come down Sowden lane past the Globe and Swan Inns and onto the Strand. After which they will turn onto Burgmann's Hill before cutting down to the Estuary Trail and back to Lympstone Commando.

EXE ESTUARY TRAIL UPDATE

Members of Lympstone Parish Council and Judith Carter, Chair of the Trail Action Group, Lympstone (TAG-L), met with representatives of Devon County Council (DCC) on 19th March to discuss the village petition for an additional off-road route for the EET in Lympstone.

The Parish Council TAG-L and presented a strong case to support the petition. However, the representatives of DCC maintained, what is in our view, a cavalier and narrow-minded position. They stated that they did not consider the development of an offpriority. road route а Despite communication of numerous accidents and near misses in the 2011 survey report and 2014 petition, DCC only recognises accidents that have been reported officially to the Police - one accident since 2005. Even the accidents reported verbally or by email to the Local Police do not count (in the eyes of DCC) if there was no official report through the 101 service. In conclusion, DCC only committed to investigate possible measures to improve safety on the existing on-road section of the EET. DCC Safety Officer will be visiting the village on 23rd April to assess whether safety can be improved in any way. Although worthwhile, this will clearly not address the underlying issues and risks, particularly in light of the expected increase in use of the EET.

The Parish Council and TAG-L are reviewing the position now and considering the best action to ensure the issue is addressed appropriately. We believe we have a strong case and should not be deterred by DCC's response to date. DCC appear to have made several errors in their management of this issue (from the EET planning stage to date). We do not wish to dwell on the past, but it is important that the risks in Lympstone are assessed and managed effectively by DCC.

We are however encouraged by Network Rail's positive response to the feasibility of developing an additional off-road route.

To support our case to DCC it is essential that accidents



and near misses are recorded formally. As you know, there is a record book in the Newsagent and we continue to encourage to write you up anv accidents, near misses and road rage in importantly this book but **more EVERYONE SHOULD** REPORT ANY ACCIDENTS (AND SERIOUS NEAR MISSES THAT RESULT IN SHOCK) TO THE POLICE USING THE 101 TELEPHONE NUMBER (and ask them to confirm that it will be recorded on the database). If you would like any help, please do not hesitate to contact me. Finally, if you have any photos of accidents or near

misses, could you please send them to the email address below.
