Planning Applications have taken up a lot of time at Parish Council meetings recently. There have been some major applications and some with challenging backgrounds.

Land at Jackson Meadow. This is a small site behind No's 14 & 15. Geoff Lill. The Chairman of the Jackson Meadow Residents Association supported by other local residents spoke at two Parish Council meetings about the problems that will come about if this site is developed for 4 Residents are particularly concerned that there will be vehicles moving close to their homes and where their children play. ideas as to how they might be reduced. However, at the meeting that followed, the Parish Council decided to object to the application on the grounds that it represented overdevelopment of the site, that the proposed access will present a hazard to pedestrians and cyclists, particularly young children living in the area and the proposed road was too close to No's 14 & 15.

Land to the rear of Meadowgate, Church Road. A plan to build 5 houses on this land using the existing footpath as an access route had been withdrawn and a new plan to build one submitted. Problems with this house identified have been and it understood that this application has also been withdrawn.

Land Hollywell at Nurseries, Courtlands Lane. This plan proposed removing 16,000 square feet of disused greenhouses and building two houses. It was suggested that this was a brownfield site and was not in the Green Wedge. The Parish Council supported the application as it would bring about a significant improvement to the area. EDDC then pointed out that it was in the Green Wedge and should be regarded as agricultural land and not brownfield. The Parish Council still supported this development.

Development Variations

The Parish Council is becoming increasingly concerned at the number developments that are of built differently from the approved planning permission. In several cases, when this has been pointed out to EDDC, a retrospective planning application is submitted at the suggestion of the Planning Officer. Often these retrospective applications are approved even though an original application for such details would have been refused. The Parish Council has written to the Chief Executive about this as it seems that there is a very clear trend for this in Lympstone. He has investigated the raised and has given some justification for the new decisions in that EDDC would have difficulty in appeals against refusal planning applications. However, this does not satisfy the complaint that original planning applications, for the final developments would have been refused.

Parish Council budget and your Council tax for next year.

The Parish Council has now approved its budget for next year. This includes providing for elections as EDDC are now charging a high amount for organising these. Also a fund has been set up to meet the Parish Council's obligation to maintain the Village Hall car park. The Parish Council, led by Cllr Mrs Terri Scott is proposing to enter into the Best Kept Village Competition run by the Devon CPRE and a sum of £300 has been included to meet the cost of any works that are needed to keep the village looking its Terri would like you all to support this bid by making sure that your bit of the Village is kept clean and tidy and well maintained. With good housekeeping, this can be achieved and you will see a very small reduction in the amount that you pay for the Parish Council share of your Council tax.

Car parking in the Village. The Parish Council has approved the list of places that it would like DCC to investigate for possible new parking restrictions. This list was published in The Lympstone Herald in December. The Parish Council has also suggested dedicated disabled person parking under the Railway Bridge, in Chapel Road and in the Car Park. It is also to

suggest that some parking in Chapel Road might be limited to 30 minutes which is felt to be enough time for people to do their shopping.

These suggestions will now go to DCC for them to investigate.

Flooding – As I write, the Village appears to have survived the high tide and strong winds over the first weekend of the month although there is still more to come. Sand bags (vou have to fill them yourself) are still available from Cllr Richard Eastley (tel 266165) or Alfie Beer. Cllr Rob Longhurst has tested a new type of bag that has granules to absorb a large quantity of water. So far they have proved successful in dealing with water getting into a building that is lower than its neighbour. For more details, give him a ring on 263495.

The Parish Council and others are still putting pressure on DCC, SWW and the Environment Agency to accept responsibility for the floods that occur regularly. This is an uphill task as it has to be appreciated that public funding to these and other bodies is being cut back by the Government. Now is the time to lobby your MP to let him know that the time has come for more investment in the Country's infrastructure to bring it up to the standard that we expect.

Health Services in Devon. Many of you will have read that health services

in Devon are being changed quite drastically with a move towards as much care at home as possible. A new health WEB is being set up at Budleigh Hospital but no clinical cases will be dealt with there. All of these will go to Exmouth Hospital. Stroke beds are also being closed so that they can be centred on Exeter. All this and more to come will result in people having to travel to receive the care that they need and deserve.


