THE ANNUAL PARISH MEETING for Lympstone

was held at 7.00pm on Monday 12th May 2014. This is not a Parish Council meeting but your meeting where you can hear what is going on in Lympstone and anyone who is on the Register of Electors can raise anything about village life.

14 members of the public came along together with WPCSO Sarah Trayhurn and District and Parish Councillors who all reported on what is happening at each Council.

Parish Council Chairman Cllr Richard Eastley opened proceedings by saying that the hot topics for the

Village have been flooding, Planning and the Exe Estuary Trail.

DCC, the Environment

Agency and South West Water have all been to the village, separately and together to meet residents and see the problems at first hand. All we need now is the action that has been

promised. Some work is expected towards the end of the year but unfortunately South West Water are saying that the sewage flooding problem cannot be solved except at great expense and they do not have the kind of money that is needed. The Parish Council will keep up the pressure on all three for some action.

The Neighbourhood Plan has been completed as far as Lympstone is concerned but it still has to get through EDDC and a Planning Inspector. EDDC's own Local Plan must be completed first and this has been rejected by a Planning Inspector. It has been said that it will take between 6 months and two years for a new Local Plan to be ready for an Inspector and this is likely to hold up the Neighbourhood Plan



Items from the Parish Council

The Parish Council entertained the Team of Flood gate



Cllr Richard Eastley has been reelected as Chairman for a second term of Office, together with Cllr Chris Carter as vice-Chairman. This Team' will lead Parish Council activities, ably supported by Parish Council Champions for the next twelve months.

Commemorating WW I

The Parish Council is applying for funds to clean and refurbish the war memorial as part of these national commemorations. Northlew poppy

seeds will be sown in the corner of the Parish Cemetery. They will also be planted in other parts of the parish by various local Groups. The PCC are arranging a Commemoration Service on 4th August to coincide with the national service.

Parking

Parking is always an issue in Lympstone just as it is in many other villages. The Parish Council has put forward



a number of suggestions to DCC for changes in the current parking restrictions and some new ones designed to make getting through the village a little easier. All have been rejected for a variety of reasons, the main one being there is no money for this kind of work.

EDDC have looked at a scheme to give more parking in the garage area at Glebe Close but again, this has been rejected as it will be too expensive.

School Hill

The new footpath to Candy's Field is to have a tarmac surface and the section outside the School gates leading to this footpath is also to be re-surfaced. Hopefully, this work will take place during the next School holidays at the end of May.

SHIP SHAPE

Despite it taking a bashing in this year's February storms, Jackie & Will have been working hard to ensure that their garden at The Lookout looks ship shape again in time for the NGS openings on the 6th & 8th of June.

Featured on TV & in the local press,

this 2-acre garden sits with its toes in the water near the mouth of the Exe Estuary. First developed in the 1920s as a purification station to save the Lympstone's ailing shellfish

Salvaged flotsam and jetsam sits amongst relaxed, naturalistic seaside planting to give that washed up from the beach feel. Over 200 varieties plants, sea-trialled for their salt, wind & drought tolerance, enjoy the challenges of coastal living.

A short circular walk leads you from an area of jungly planting through a wild flower meadow to a pond then winds through a small copse and back above the shore to a Mediterranean courtyard, with numerous places to stop and take in the views and salty air.

Quiet Prayer Time —Please join us for half an hour of prayer, readings and quiet contemplation. For more information, or just a chat, please ring Demelza on 272243.





EXTRA TRAINS THIS SUMMER

Starting on Bank Holiday Sunday 25th May. seven extra trains will run from Exeter to Exmouth and return, giving a half hourly service for much of the day on Sundays until September. Four of the extra trains from Exmouth will go to St David's, the others will terminate at Exeter Central. All the extra trains will call at Lympstone Village, Topsham and Digby & Sowton. The extra trains this summer are supported by Devon County Council and are in new timetable booklets.

The Avocet Line Rail Users Group (ALRUG) has been campaigning for a half hourly Sunday service year round, with all trains running to and from Exeter St David's to connect with the main line. First Great Western have now indicated that their long term intention is to run such a service, but that they do not have enough trains at present.

I ask that residents continue to be vigilant at this time and report any suspicious behaviour to Police. It is important that it is reported at the time of the incident taking place.

58 crimes were recorded in the previous report last year so there has been an increase of 26 crimes. This is mainly due to the issues we had with the burglaries to military accommodation, the criminal damage to vehicles and the spate of theft from vehicles.
