# From the Parish Council meeting

#### Car Parking in the Village

This has been the subject of much public interest and debate at Parish Council meetings. So much so that it will be the major item of discussion at the next meeting on 15th October 2012. noticed been that has householders are not parking in their drives, but are taking up valuable parking spaces in the road outside. This is not a Lympstone attitude and so the Parish Council appeals to all of you to use your garage and driveway for parking to free up spaces on the road for those who have no off-street parking of their own.

EDDC have now issued 120 permits for the 84 spaces on the Village car park in Underhill. Clearly this is not sustainable. They are reviewing the way they manage car parks and may do away with District-wide permits so that any permits are specific to a particular car park. A Working Party has come up with some ideas to tweak the operations at the car park in Underhill and there may be an opportunity to review this if EDDC change their system.

Parking on the road has increased recently, to the extent that it is now causing obstruction. If we are not careful, DCC will consider putting double yellow lines in some areas, notably Church Road and School Hill to overcome this. Civil Enforcement officers are now being asked to work in the evenings and may target these areas for extra visits.

It is clear, however, that more space for parking is needed. The Parish Council has provided extra spaces at the Village Hall and these are proving their worth, but the Parish Council cannot 'make' land and so the Village needs land owners to come forward to offer land for this. After all, houses won't be built on all the vacant land that we have. Smaller plots in several locations will help to ease the problem across the village. The Parish Council is asking anyone who might be able to offer space for parking to come forward to discuss what they might have to offer.

# Neighbourhood Planning and the Local Plan.

Those of you who are interested in how the parish should develop or not, as the case may be, will have been following the topical planning matters interest and some of you will have taken part in Focus Groups. The pace is hotting up, partly because EDDC do not have the staff to carry out the work and so they are asking parishes to take on a greater role. The Strategic Housing Land Availability Assessment is now entering its third review. Landowners and Parishes have been able to submit sites for consideration for future housing development. These sites are all being assessed against strict criteria to show whether they are suitable for development. Members of Lympstone's Neighbourhood Plan Working Party has carried out an assessment of each site and this assessment will be discussed at a meeting of the Parish Council. Please check the agendas on the Notice Boards to see if this is to be considered at the next meeting on 15th October.

After that, there is to be an open exhibition and presentation about all of the sites in the Village Hall on 23rd November 2012. Again, keep an eye on the Notice Boards to confirm this.

This is not an easy task and some developers and owners will be disappointed, but the process is quite stringent and must be applied equally to all sites. EDDC have to show that there is a 'Land-bank' to provide for five years of housing need and this has to have a 20% cushion to give developers some choice. The land availability will need to be kept under review and so the process is likely to be repeated in future years.

#### Management of the Village Shop

This was the subject of more discussion at the Parish Council meeting with some concern being shown at the points that were made at the last meeting. Miles Freeman wrote to the Parish Council giving some insight and background to both the Village Shop and the Post Office. It seems that there are some negotiations going on in the background and so the Parish Council felt that the matter should now rest with the two businesses concerned in the hope that a reasonable way forward can be found for both to provide a service to the village.

#### And finally,

Some of you may have heard or read about the new sign erected in Wotton

Lane by George and Mary Truell. There is no doubt that Wotton Lane is now very busy and many motorists are in a rush. It is also de-restricted and so it has a high national speed limit for the conditions it offers. The sign read: 'Slow - heaven is full!' This attracted many comments and caused DCC to investigate with a view to having the sign removed as it does not meet normal highway wording. They have found, as George and Mary already knew that the sign was on private land and so they have closed their file on the matter. So the sign will remain as a warning to drivers and as a display of the character of this special village

By letting the boats drift there was the potential for a great amount of damage and risk to life of other users of the Estuary. You can bring your own apples for pressing: bring clean apples or pears in a bucket or wheelbarrow (more by arrangement!). The crushed fruit is decanted into 1 litre containers – you can bring your own milk containers, well-washed, or you can buy new clean containers at cost. If you haven't any apples, you can buy freshly squeezed apple juice at £1.50 per litre or £5 for 5 litres. Fresh apple juice can be safely kept in the fridge for a few days or frozen.

The entrance fee (£2.50 for adults, children under 12 free) includes the opportunity to taste a wide variety of apples, and record your favourite.

You can shop at the stalls and admire the quilt display. You can join in the country dancing (before or after visiting the cider tent?). Listen to live entertainment. Enjoy tea, coffee and cakes or a light lunch. Join in the games: try to beat the Guinness World Record for the longest unbroken apple peeling of 172 ft 4in (no, it's not a typo!). Get the chance to win one of Kay Uphill's fabulous cakes or a bottle of award-winning Devon cider brandy


(who needs Calvados?!). And, of course, you can enjoy the opportunity to chat with friends in a beautiful old orchard setting.

#### ESTUARY LEAGUE OF FRIENDS

We are very grateful to Lympstone Parish Council and those working on the Neighborhood Plan for this chance to introduce our charity to the village.

We are a Topsham-based charity, operating not only in Topsham itself but also Countess Wear, Clyst St Marv. Clyst St George, Ebford, Exton and the Cat & Fiddle.

Our small team of dedicated staff. along with a much larger pool of undertake volunteers. over 12,000 hours of work every year to provide a total of 14 core services.

Many are communal services such as our 'Stretch Your Eyes' outings, our twice-weekly day centre and lunch clubs, or our fortnightly Reminiscence Cafe for those with memory issues and their carers. On Christmas Day we hold a lunch for those who may otherwise not see anyone or even have a hot meal - this year we expect well over 100 people.

Increasingly. some activities are tailored to individual needs. These include transport to and from medical appointments, help for carers via the Take A Break scheme, gardening, nailcutting or befriending those who may be housebound with no immediate Demelza Henderson family.

We levy a small charge for services, usually well below market rates. This income, along with proceeds from our two charity shops in Topsham, is vital as it enables the charity to survive.

In late October we will conduct a survey, kindly funded by the Parish Council, to assess potential demand for Estuary's services in Lympstone. A newsletter outlining our activities and asking for your views will drop through your letterbox in a few weeks' time.

We will analyse the results and will of course - in line with our approach everywhere else - introduce services for which there is demand, which are within our remit and do not conflict with existing providers in the locality.

# A TRIP DOWN MEMORY LANE, PART 2




#### WI

On October 3<sup>rd</sup> Father Stephen Hoyle brought news of the Pine Ridge Indian Reservation in South Dakota, USA, where he has served as priest-inresidence. Pine Ridge is the home of the Oglala Lakota (Sioux) Nation, but any preconceived ideas based on old western films were soon dispelled as we learned about the Lakota people's long history as a nomadic group of hunter-gatherer tribes and their present challenging situation.

The land legally reserved for their exclusive use in 1876 was shrunk and despoiled by decree and settlers rushing for gold to the point where it couldn't support buffalo and the native people lost their traditional source of food, clothing and shelter. Today, the Pine Ridge Reservation – a sovereign nation in its own right – is the second poorest community in the western hemisphere after Haiti Τt been called has 'America's Third World'

Father Stephen spoke in support of a project Lakota-run to build Coffee/Crafts Shop and then a exchange retreat/cultural centre to enable groups to visit the reservation, Brenda Courtie

bringing income and aid where there is no federal support. His compassion and enthusiasm for his Lakota 'family' won him many supporters.
