Budget

For the next month the Village Hall Management Committee has asked the Parish Council to fund £20,000 of worth of works as part of a bigger package of repairs and improvements. The parish Council can only afford to do this by using its reserves, cutting its spending and by raising extra funds from the village. The initial view was that the precept would need to increase by at least £5.00 per average Band D property. The Finance Committee and the Parish Council has looked very closely at its spending for the next year and has been able to keep the increase to below £5. This will mean that there is little room for new of unplanned spending throughout the year. The Council Parish will look for opportunities to raise funds for some of the spending, including works to the Village Hall. 


You get petrol money/expenses, and your own car insurance will cover you for being a volunteer driver.
