## ITEMS OF NOTE from the Parish Council January Meeting

### **A New Baby for Sarah**

The Parish Council was very pleased to hear that our very own WPCSO, Sarah Trayhurn had given birth to a bouncing baby boy. Sarah is a great asset to the Parish and her work is being carried on very ably by PC Simon Halloran and WPCSO Donna Baker.

The Parish Council has purchased a 'Nappy Cake' made by a local craftsperson for Sarah. This was presented to the meeting on 4th January and Simon was asked to pass this on to Sarah with all our best wishes.

### **Flooding across the Parish.**

The Parish Council is aware of several areas where flooding occurs regularly on roads and footpaths. A meeting is being requested with DCC Councillors and Officers to point out the detail of the problems in the worst cases. It is their responsibility to make sure that all public drains and ditches are

working properly and we want to make sure that they are aware of their responsibilities and the need for action in Lymestone. If you know of any areas where flooding is a problem, please report this to Tony Mathews, Area Engineer, DCC, Little Moor House, Falcon Road, Sowton, Exeter, Devon, EX2 7PL

In the meantime, the police report that most of their work in the Village at the moment is dealing with accidents due to the bad weather, flooding and freezing conditions do not go well together and so do take care and if you see anyone who is in trouble, please do not hesitate to lend a hand.

### **Street Lighting**

The Parish Council have supported the view by DCC that street lights can be switched off late at night. The existing part-night lighting in Lymestone is timed to switch off between midnight and 06.30am, so the change to 12.30am and 05.30 will benefit train users and early risers. DCC will let the Parish Council know when the change is to take place. **Cont**

In the meantime, EDDC propose to switch off lights in the car park at 11.00 to save money. The Parish Council has objected to this and put forward the counter argument that the lights should stay on all night or at least follow the pattern for the street lights. We will continue to press our case for this. It has been suggested that anyone who suffers minor damage to their car at the car Park does not bother to report this to the Police. The Parish Council urges that reports are made for all damage. By doing this you will get a crime number to pass to your insurance Company and you will help build up statistics on the level of crime in the area. This could then lead to more positive action.

## **Affordable houses**

The Planning Committee considered a scheme by EDDC to provide 9 affordable houses on land near to Churchill Court. An Open Day was held last month when there was chance to view the plans and discuss these with Officers of EDDC. The Parish Council welcomes more affordable housing in the Parish and sees no reason to oppose the plans. It is not entirely happy with the layout and its effect on other amenities in the area. It has put forward the following comments;

1 The layout will mean the loss of car parking spaces. Around five of these are used during the day and more than twice this number in the evenings.

2 The layout removes open land and the houses will have small gardens. This has reduced local opportunities for play.

3 Replacement parking could be provided on the grassed area in Trafalgar Road which is not used.

4 There should be a financial contribution towards improvement in local amenities as no local facilities will be provided as part of this scheme. A private developer would normally be required to make such a payment.

5 The scheme should include widening of part of Gibraltar Road to cope with increased traffic.

6 EDDC should not assume that the Play Area provided by the MoD will always be available for general use.

## PARISH CHURCH

Christmas Service attendance was up this year by over 15%. (though not at the 8 am service which was the same as last year.)

### **Family Service and Family Eucharist**

The Family Service at 4 pm takes place on the third Sunday (17th this month) of each month because we are having a Family Eucharist at 9.30 on the first Sunday of each month, the next being 7th.Feb. Other Sunday morning Eucharist services will remain unchanged with Sunday School for children.

One of the difficulties with the Eucharist service is making it 'child friendly' and still appropriate for all worshippers.

The Diocese had asked for 20 parishes to trial a new service for six months and we put forward our church as a good example with our attempts to encourage families to attend church and that we are now part of the worship community with Littleham and Exmouth.

We have just heard that we have been chosen for this experimental service and the order, giving permission, has been signed by the Archbishops of Canterbury and York! This will run on the first Sundays each month until June. Come and experience the differences. The service on Sunday 3rd January was taken by Prebendary Ian Morter with our Curate Georgina Vie and Rev Geoffrey Wrayford to get the new

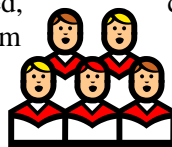
service procedure off to a confident start.

## THE GATEKEEPERS IN 2009

The Environment Agency flood protection service contacted the Lympstone volunteer floodgate team to close the estuary gates 15 times during 2009, most closures were for two to three days. The floodgate team worked with the Agency to seek to improve the formula used for predicting the need to close the gates, adding local knowledge to the more global weather and tidal data used. The annual review meeting between representatives of the Environment Agency and the volunteers concluded that the scheme continues to work well. The Agency inspects the main flood defences weekly and is usually quick to respond to calls from members of the team when any of the gates needs attention. The team is grateful to the Harbour Board for enabling equipment to be kept at the boat shelter and to the new owners of Limekiln House, Paul and Teresa, for agreeing that the emergency flood boards can continue to be stored in the former lime kilns by Peter's Tower. The current floodgate team comprise Alan Burton (team leader), Ollie Creighton, John Bennet, John Brassington, Graham Brister, Paul Hickson, Richard Speight, John Welton and Mai Targett who is our first woman volunteer.

## HALF WAY HERE

When we started fundraising for the Village Hall last year I was frankly not convinced that asking for individual donations would be very fruitful. How wrong could I have been. To date 62 individuals have donated over £7000. I was amazed at people's generosity. It is however surprising to me that only one person has taken up the idea of donating by Standing Order. Many of us would not miss £5 a month or quarterly out of our account and all it entails is filling out a simple form (available from Don Mildenhall on 260500), and passing it back to me or him.

If individual donations were not for everyone then the Lottery certainly did appeal. 180 lottery tickets have been sold which I think is fantastic. Viv Day has done all the ground work and administration and £1,195 has been added to the fund.

We've also had a marvellous response from the Tennis Club, Furry Dance, Garden Club, WI and Art Group who together have contributed £1,732.

Having worked so hard as a group to get fund raising off the ground I was worried that we would run out of ideas but I did not count on the ingenuity of the various groups and individuals. So plenty for those amongst us who are competitive.

Hazel Eaton-Terry is doing a sponsored swim in February and there is going to be a fabulous evening with wine tasting organised by Shirley Wilkes as well as many many other exciting and varied ideas in the pipeline. Hopefully there will be so many activities going on during the year to add to your enjoyment of life that fundraising for the Village Hall will be fun.

The Fund now stands at £10,270 so we are over halfway to our target of raising £20,000 by Easter of 2010. Sincere and grateful thanks to everyone who has helped by giving money or their time.
