## MORE NEW HOUSES IN LYMPSTONE

The Parish Council have received informal enquiries from landowners for two new developments in the Parish. Parish Councillors have met the Architect and landowner's representative for development of land at Glebelands to discuss his ideas. They will also now arrange to meet the landowner for land at the top of Underhill Close. The Housing Needs Survey will need to be updated to show the need for affordable houses as part of each development. It is hoped that this will be done in conjunction with the July issue of the Lymington Herald.

## PARISH COUNCIL MEETINGS

The Parish Council has decided to try a new way of working in order to try to achieve more for the Parish. Committees have been abandoned and instead, the Parish Council will meet twice each month. These meetings will be on the first and Third Mondays of each month (unless this is a Bank Holiday). All meetings are open to the Public and each meeting will start with a Public session, when anyone can come along and speak about anything of interest in the Parish, good or bad. Any current planning applications will be dealt with next so that anyone who is interested in any development,

including an applicant, can sit in the meeting and hear any comments

. Again, any visitors will be given the opportunity to speak or ask questions about any planning application.

The first meeting will receive reports from the Police, County and District Councillors and the Chairman. Other Parish Councillors can raise any matter for investigation and discussion at a later meeting.

The second meeting will focus on the nuts and bolts of the work of the Parish Council. The Parish Council has appointed ‘Champions’ to take the lead on some areas of business. The discussion at the second meeting will include discussion on any current matters on the following topics:

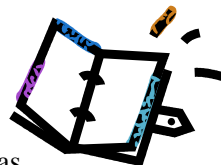

## WASTE STRATEGY PUBLIC CONSULTATION

Devon County Council's Waste Core Strategy Issues and Options Consultation



Report has been drawn up to help identify the most appropriate areas of the county for waste management activities and to provide policies for considering waste planning applications to 2031. The Waste Core Strategy will consider almost all types of waste including commercial and industrial waste, construction, demolition and excavation waste and hazardous waste, as well as the municipal waste collected from Devon's households. The public consultation is being held until Thursday 21 July. To provide people with the opportunity to comment on the strategy, a number of consultation events will be held at the several venues including the Guildhall Shopping Centre, Exeter 16 June, 11am-4pm.

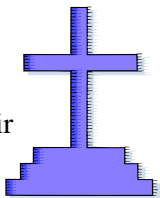

## SOLAR POWER



I thought an update may be interesting to anyone thinking about installing photo-voltaic cells. I write this as a follow up to last year's meeting organised by Jenny Moon when she introduced an installer and I to talk about our experiences.

Photo voltaic cells are panels which, when fitted onto south-facing roofs, provide electricity from sunlight. The electric companies have to pay the owner of the panels for every kilowatt produced and a further sum for any power fed into the grid. Additionally, the owner uses the power generated and therefore has a reduced electricity bill.

The system fitted to our roof has now been generating for 12 months and we have received payments equal to 9.4% of the initial cost of the installation. Additionally, our standing order has fallen too and the combined effect is that the return on the investment is about 12%. Therefore the 'payback' time will be far less than the 25 years that the electric companies have promised to pay the tariff.

The good news does not end there as the price they pay is increased annually in line with one of the cost of living indexes and this has translated into a further 2p a kilowatt payment since April.

So, if you have a south facing roof, spare cash and trust the government not to change the law this is a sound investment. (or a light in the dark!)

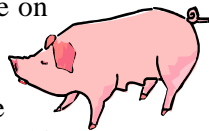

There have been so many clever ideas for fundraising; two of the most recent

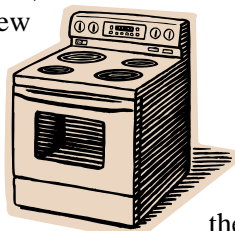

We already have £12,000 available for the works on the new kitchen out of the total of £15,000 that needs to be raised; the rest of the £28,000 cost will come from



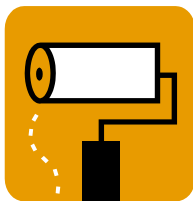
the hall's own funds. The works start at the end of July. Any shortfall would come from the hall reserves - kept for emergencies - and would be repaid from future fundraising.

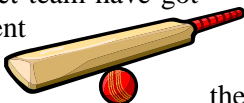

## CRICKETERS' GOOD START

Lympstone's cricket team have got off to a confident start this summer, under the leadership of new captain, Ben Ingham, (that's not our District Councillor, but Jason's lad). Only faltering in the opening match at Newton Poppleford thanks to an insistence that everyone bowl two overs, the villagers have triumphed in their next three matches, all away from home. The Woodbury win was sweet revenge for a 10 wicket drubbing in the last local derby two years' ago, as this time Lympstone not only posted their best ever total of 176-6, but also won by their widest ever margin, restricting the home side to 68-4. At the idyllic Killerton ground Jamie Cooke led the way with an

I would advise that any near misses or incidents are reported in writing to Nigel Frost of Highways. Give a time, date and a brief account or where and what happened. I personally

feel that the cycle track is very positive and the council have done a fantastic job creating it, however I do have concerns over safety.

Parking on Station Hill continues to be a problem for garage users. Please can I ask residents/visitors not to park opposite the garages. Tickets for obstruction could be issued in the future if it continues.

Dog Fouling in the Glebelands area has again been highlighted. Please clear up after your dog. If you know anyone who is failing to do so, please contact me with details.

And finally... An adults bike which is pink in colour has been secured to the bike racks outside the Swan and has not been moved since December. Does anyone know who owns this bike or if it has been abandoned?
