



From the Parish Council

The ANNUAL PARISH MEETING took place at 7.30 on Monday 21st May 2012, before the Parish Council meeting. This is a meeting of the electors of the Parish when any matter of concern to the Parish can be discussed. It is a legal requirement to hold this meeting but it is also somewhat pointless as there is always a public session at the start of each meeting and the Chairman usually allows anyone to speak at a Parish Council meeting during discussion on any topic. All of the matters that have been raised have come through the Parish Council at some time. The form of this meeting has been tested in different ways for the last few years and after last year's meeting, it was decided to reduce it to a short session before a parish Council meeting. This seemed to work reasonably well.

Several people raised problems associated with cycling and speeding traffic in the village - . There was a good discussion on all of these but solutions lie with DCC and Officers are adamant that nothing will be done as there are no serious accident statistics to back up the need for action.

Parking is also a major problem as there is a lack of facilities all through the Village. The car park in Underhill is now full on most days and is leading to parking in Underhill Crescent bringing about problems for residents trying to get into and out of their drives safely.

The Parish Council considered making an application to EDDC to take over the car park about 3 years ago. This was resisted at the time. Under the localism Act, the Parish Council can make a formal application which has to be considered. The process for preparing a strong bid will be starting soon with Cllr Jim Bailey, Champion for traffic matters, leading the way.

The Parish Council meeting was attended by a lively group of residents from the Glebelands area, led by Mrs Kath Rogers. They were there mainly to raise their objections to a planning application to develop some land behind the houses, with a vehicle access into Glebelands. The land is outside the development boundary but can be treated as an 'Exception site'. The parish plan suggested that any development should be from the village centre outwards but if there was to be any development outside the Centre then it should be to the north of the Parish rather to the south to avoid coalescence with Exmouth. The land was also identified under the Strategic Housing Land Availability assessment as having potential for development.

The residents thought that the application should be objected to on the grounds of loss of privacy to existing houses, loss of local parking space and increased traffic on a road that already has high traffic movements and on-street parking.

The Parish Council rejected the application on several grounds, including that the application was premature due to work on the Neighbourhood Plan.

VILLAGE HALL NEWS

We are now close to reaching our target to fund the work to rebuild the hall's toilet block and so the work is definitely going ahead. £20,000 will come from a loan (repayable over 5 years at the very low interest rate of 1.55%), £13,000 from the hall's own reserves and income and £2000 from a generous donation from the Pre-school, which will benefit from new child-sized toilets. The balance of around £5000 is from events and donations since last autumn – we now need just a further £800 by August. Thanks and well done to everyone involved.



The hall will be affected by the building works during the school summer holidays. The main hall, function room, bar and kitchen will be closed 8am-6pm on weekdays from 23 July until late August, except for events already booked. Bookings can be accepted for weekends and evenings. The committee room will remain available for hire at any time. Temporary toilets will be provided in a trailer and disabled cubicle located in the car park.

Since 2009 we have spent £150,000 improving the hall, with over £45,000 of this coming from donations, events and gift aid. Our next plans are to improve the committee room and repaint the exterior of the main hall.

CAN YOU HELP TO SHAPE THE LYPSTONE NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN?

COULD YOU SPARE A COUPLE OF HOURS TO TAKE PART IN A FOCUS GROUP?

What is a Neighbourhood Plan?

A Neighbourhood Plan is a new way in which the local community can influence planning in the area in which they live and work. Lympstone is now in the process of producing its Neighbourhood Plan.

What has happened so far?

A working party has been established to guide the work. An open meeting on 18th April was attended by around 80 people and generated lots of ideas. We now need to explore these in more detail.

How can I get involved in the next stage?

The next stage is to run a series of focus groups. These will involve a small group of local people, from different backgrounds and with different views, meeting for one and a half hours to share their views about key issues that could be included in the Neighbourhood Plan. The focus groups will be facilitated to make sure everyone is able to contribute and the time is used as effectively as possible. Whilst participants are not 'representatives' their contribution needs to be on behalf of the wider community, not just personal or narrow interest.

We are planning to run three focus groups:

Community: this group will start by identifying what makes our community, and what is missing. Then we will focus on things such as the school, the involvement of older and younger people, communications, and meeting places.

Environment: we will identify the key landscape features (such as open spaces, footpaths, wooded areas) that need to be protected, and the key design issues that will preserve the visual appearance of the village. Then we will explore a variety of 'green' issues, e.g. climate change.

Infrastructure: this group will discuss transport – cars, buses and rail – in the village. We will also consider how we can maximise the benefits and minimise any problems of the cycle track, and what view we should take about the route of the Dinan Way extension, and what we would like done to mitigate its impact on the parish.

The focus groups will meet at the Village Hall from 7.30-9.30 pm on:

Community: Tuesday 26th June

Infrastructure: Tuesday 3rd July

Environment: Wednesday 4th July

We need about 10 people for each group - as wide a range of people as possible. Please contact the facilitator Mark Robertson at diamondfacilitation@yahoo.co.uk or ring him on 268905 or 07827 413963 if you can help, indicating which focus group you would like to contribute to.

Later in the year there will be an additional focus group to consider housing and development. There will be further information about this on the website and in the Herald.

What else is happening?

Alongside the focus groups we will be consulting with a range of people with a particular interest. For example, local businesses, children and young people, and local landowners.

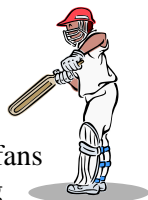
LYMPSTONE PLAYERS

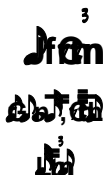
