## News from the Parish Council

The last couple of meetings have seen markedly increased numbers of residents taking part and this is a good thing. Before I took this job as Clerk to Lymington Parish Council, I was told that meetings were lively and interesting. This still holds true some nine years later. Frequently, we have 20 or more people coming along to hear and take part in discussion about the important things that are taking place in Lymington.

The main topic of discussion, as regular readers will know, has been the **Neighbourhood Plan**.

Some of the discussion has been controversial but this is mainly due to lack of knowledge or a refusal to understand how The Plan is being put together. The Parish Council hopes that everyone will keep an open mind and will think about the details of The

Plan before sending in their response forms.

The NP is now open for public consultation Documents can be found at the post office, Shears café and Exmouth library. The draft plan and supporting documents can also be found at the village website.

The Plan is not set in stone but includes ideas expressed by residents at previous open exhibitions and Focus Group meetings. The Parish Council appreciates that not everyone will have been able to attend the previous sessions so there will be two more on 5<sup>th</sup> & 6<sup>th</sup> July in the Village Hall when the draft Plan and members of the Working group were available to answer questions.

Jenny is a past Chairman of the Parish Council and during her time, worked tirelessly with Jane Moffatt to resurrect the village Youth Club after it was dramatically closed due to dubious activities. The Youth Club has had some lean patches but now, nine years later, is still providing an excellent meeting place for village children under the able leadership of Eddie Mingo. The Youth Club is still growing and there is always room for more members. Just go along on a Friday evening to see what it is all about. The range of activities is increasing all the time so don't miss out.

Lympstone Parish Council has purchased plants for our summer displays again this year and most of the village flower beds have been planted out by a team of very able and willing volunteers. 17TH AUGUST**

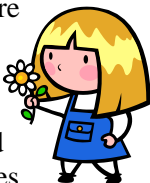

## **LITTER PICKING**



The WI has for the last 30 years undertaken a regular litter pick. ## LYMPSTONE POLICE REPORT FOR HERALD

### Update regarding thefts from vehicles:



We have had another 3 thefts from vehicles reported to Police since the last newsletter which occurred in the area of Strawberry Hill and Greenhill Avenue. This took place overnight of the 9<sup>th</sup> June. Exton and Ebford have also been targeted and it is believed that the offender is using the cycle track. This offender who is described as a slim male has been going onto private driveways to check vehicles so please be aware.

Because of the recent increase in theft from vehicles in the village the Neighbourhood Police team have been out knocking on doors in the areas where there have been thefts and making residents aware of these crimes and offering crime prevention advice. We have been encouraging residents to sign up to our community messaging system and so far have had 58 forms returned which is a brilliant result.

Dedicated Officers have also been patrolling the village and cycle track throughout the night in plain clothes and several people have been stop checked in the area.

I am pleased to report that at this point we have had no further reports of theft from vehicles since the 9<sup>th</sup> June. We ask residents to remain vigilant and please ensure your vehicle is properly secured. If you see any person or

vehicle acting suspiciously please contact police.

Between the 23<sup>rd</sup> and 24<sup>th</sup> June, three outboard motor engines were stolen from boats moored on the estuary at Lymptstone. It is believed a small wooden vessel taken from the harbour was used to reach the boats. The engines were stolen using cutting equipment/bolt croppers and then the boats set adrift. It is possible the offenders used Parsonage Stiles (Burgmanns Hill area) to come ashore and unload. If anyone has any information on these thefts or has seen anyone acting suspiciously in the run up to the 24<sup>th</sup> please contact the police on 101 quoting KE/13/1426.

I have been made aware that dog fouling in the allotments has increased and dog owners are not picking up after their animals. Posters politely requesting that owners pick up have been repeatedly torn down or destroyed. These posters are making people aware of the issue and I would request that they are left in place.

### A HANDBAG!



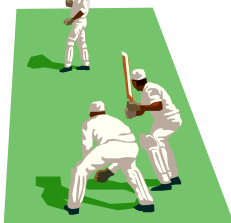
