GOOD NEWS ON BROADBAND

The promised increase in broad band speed in Lymington has started. I received this from a reliable user today.

“- iPad speeds are slower but very good still! They are now at 25Mb down and 13Mb uploads. Before we had 4.3

down and 0.36 upload! I've just tested my computer on wifi and we can get up to 80Mb and are getting 79.8Mb into the house. My computer on wifi is receiving 74.8Mb on wifi and 13.7mb upload all on wifi!

There is also a dual speed, I have learnt, which helps tv and other media connections which use high and large volumes of data. Standard speed is 2.4Mhz but there is also a new 5Mhz which streams the data separately and faster, leaving the 2.4 stream for other general usage. Only found that out when I connected the tv for iplayer and was given the choice!

I'm not sure if the dual speed was just an **infinity 2** choice but since there was only 50p difference for us (with infinity 1) and other things were included at £26/mth we obviously went for 2.”

(Unfortunately it has not reached Greenhill Ave yet. Ed)

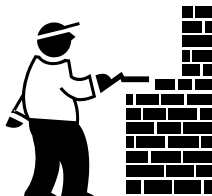

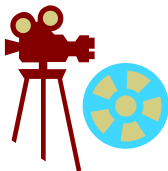

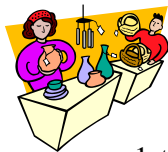

LYMPSTONE POLICE REPORT

Burglaries in Gibraltar and Trafalgar Road

In the last newsletter I informed residents that there had been a number of burglaries in the above areas. Since then we have had a further two burglaries in Gibraltar road. During this time there have been a number of suspicious incidents in the area and Police have been called on a number of occasions. There was also one reported incident in Jacksons Meadow.

The local Neighbourhood Police team would like to reassure the public that we are investigating and responding to these incidents. The Police helicopter has been up on a number of occasions and the Police dog has also attended. We are regularly patrolling the area day and night and we continue to work with the Marine Camp to offer support to families.

This level of crime is unusual for Lymptstone and at this time it has only occurred in the above roads. We ask that residents remain vigilant at this time and report any person or vehicle acting suspiciously. Please consider your security and ensure your property is secured at all times.

Parking

Once again can I ask residents to please be mindful when parking in the area of the Strand. Please do not obstruct



pavements or junctions. I am aware that this area is very busy, but please consider pedestrians as they should not be forced to walk in the road because the pavement is blocked.

Damage
