# ITEMS OF NOTE from the Parish Council Dec. Meeting

# HM The Queen's Diamond Jubilee Celebrations 2 - 5 June 2012.

The first public meeting was held on 29th November 2011 to come up with ideas for ways in which the Village can celebrate this major national event. The Parish Council has already agreed to take the lead in encouraging all Village organisations to be involved in various events so that everyone in the Village is able to take part.

The National format for the celebrations is to be:

Sporting events, a big Sunday lunch, a Chain of 2012 beacons around the country and a Thanksgiving Service.

In Lympstone, the following suggestions were raised at the first public meeting:

The Village Hall has been provisionally reserved for the weekend but the Function Room is in use for an Art Exhibition.

Cllr Carter has discussed a River Pageant with the Sailing Club as part of its programme for next year. The Sailing Club have agreed to include this in their programme.

The PCC are planning a Service, Flower display and possibly a peel of bells.

CTCRM is to be invited to be involved in the church celebrations.

The PTFA are considering events.

The Parish Council will find out about the process for street closures for street parties. Details will be published as soon as they are available.

The Parish Council will consider distributing mugs to all children under 11 in the parish. It was noted that 250 may be needed.

The History Society will consider a photo-book of people standing in front of their houses a a local record of both. Volunteers are needed to take responsibility for one or more of the flower beds for the year. Mrs Netherington will ask if the beavers could take responsibility for a flower bed as a badge project.

The Furry Dance Committee will be asked to have the bunting up in time for the celebrations.

There will be an approach to the Football Club, the tennis club, and the cricket club regarding Jubilee matches. There will be a Village Fun Run

Robert Harrison is to be asked to organise a 'Beating of the bounds'

Consideration to be given to a permanent memorial including a tree and the Photo- Book

The Environment Agency to be asked to provide a flagpole that was to be provided as part of completion of the flood gates works. If one is in place, the Lympstone flag to be flown.

The Twinning Committee to be asked if they wish to arrange an event.

The Youth Club to be asked if they wish to arrange an event and to make the hall available.

The WI have offered to assist others in the arranging and holding of events. They may also arrange an event of their own such as a tapestry or sewing event leading up to the celebrations. Jubilee Jam was also mentioned!

There will be a beacon on Cliff Field. Consideration is to be given to an event on Cliff Field during the day and/or evening around this and fireworks to finish..

The Lympstone Band to be requested to play at one of the events.


The Furry Dance Committee and the Sailing Club are to be asked to offer marquees for use on Candy's Field Investigation into the closure of one of

the main roads into the Village for a big street party with a possible charge for tables in order to help meet costs.

A Jubilee Poem for Lympstone

Cllr Carter will compile CD's of 1950's music to play at parties. If you can offer any suggestions or music for recording, please let Chris know what you have.

Most events will have a cost involved, especially fireworks which will be expensive, due to high demand at this time. The Parish Council will include some money in its budget for next year but if Groups could organise fundraising activities to meet the cost of their events, this will be very welcome



next 10 years. This is now available for public comment via the EDDC website. Cllr Rob Longhurst has been leading the Parish Council through the process ofsubmission to the Development Framework (LDF) which some of you may have taken part in or just heard about. The New Local Plan is the current Government's view of the way that Planning for our area should be handled. It is important that we have our say as this will guide decisions on Planning Applications for a long time.

The next stage is to produce a Neighbourhood Plan which will build on the Village Design Statement, the Parish Plan and the LDF submission and should carry even greater weight than the LDF submission. Guidance on how to produce a Neighbourhood Plan is only just coming out but the Parish Council will make sure that a great effort is put into getting this right. There will be much more about this in the New Year.

### **Public Conveniences**

You may have noticed some improvements to the Public



Conveniences on the Underhill Car compiling a Park. The Parish Council lease these from EDDC and under the lease they have to carry out regular maintenance and redecoration. At the moment. complete repainting, inside and out, is being carried out by Graham Brister and plumbing improvements, including installing waterless urinals is being carried out by Andy Hurst. Both jobs were put out to tender and the Parish Council is very pleased to have been able to put the work to contractors from village. Waterless the urinals are proving very popular in many places and it is hoped that they will be successful in Lympstone. It is expected that this will result in the saving of hundreds of £'s on the running costs.

# Village Exercise

At the meeting of the Parish Council on 21st November, 2011, Major Alex Maclay thanked the whole Village for the

way in which the Village Exercise for Young Officers had been embraced by the whole community. he regarded this years exercise as a success and very helpful for those who took part. Some thought is now being given as to whether an exercise could take place during school term time next year. If you have any comments about this please let Cllr Acca or Tony Priest, Head of Lympstone Primary School know your views.

### Village School

Tony Priest, Head of Lympstone Primary School also came to the Parish Council meeting to explain how the being school was run and it's relationship with DCC. There currently 186 pupils on the School Roll whereas the admissions number was calculated to be 177. However, the Appeals Panel often gave places beyond the ;Official' number and so this reduced local control over the number ofchildren to he accommodated. The Governors are still giving great thought as to how a new portable classroom can be fitted into the School site, including the use of the site of the Church rooms, which is to be funded by the PCC.






