Exe Estuary Trail

DCC and your Parish Council, with members of the Exe Estuary Trail



Group have agreed that DCC **can** lay a cobbled surface on some of the roads that link the EET through Lympstone as an experiment to test their effectiveness. These are not proper cobbles but a stick-on sheet with cobble-like additions. They are intended to slow the speed of cyclists and to guide them to use the correct side of the road. The 'cobbles' will be located:

- 1. On The Strand at the bottom of Station Hill.
- 2. On Sowden Lane on the bend by the slipway where they will be laid along the centre of the carriageway to guide cyclists in both directions,
- 3. Three rows of cobbles will be laid on Sowden Lane as it comes down Cox's Hill towards The Strand and the junction of Quay Lane.

The Parish Council did not wish DCC to install cobbles at the junction of Chapel Road and The Strand as it was felt that this would increase the hazard to cyclist and pedestrians rather than improve the situation. The Parish Council also did not wish to have 'cobbles' outside residents entrances along Sowden Lane as it was felt that these were not needed.

The installation of cobbles in the 3 locations is on a trial basis and if they are not successful in slowing cyclists or cause problems for cyclists, other users or residents these could be removed by DCC. DCC will carry the liability for any injuries should they be caused by the proposed strips of cobbles.

The Parish Council have asked how DCC plan to monitor these during a trial period.

DCC might be able to install a camera to monitor the traffic at the bottom of Station Hill and anecdotal evidence from residents will be acceptable with regard to the success or problems associated with these cobbles. Any Parish Councillor will be happy to receive any comments from residents about these.

Underhill car park

About three years ago, EDDC asked if the Parish Council was interested in



taking over ownership of the Underhill car park. This was discussed at the time and a group was set up to look into the implications of this.

Cllr Rob Longhurst presented his report to the meeting of the Parish Council on 19th October. This can be found with the agenda for that meeting on www.lympstone.org.

EDDC are not able to supply details of running costs in the short term or the longer term.

There are a number of questions that the Parish Council would like a clearer understanding about before they feel able to make any decision about this:

Legal powers to make rules for the use of the car park;

The type of rules that could be made including issuing permits for specific spaces or for general use of the car park;

Whether EDDC parking permits would apply to the car park and on what terms.

Issue of new Parish Council permits, cost and length they would be valid for;

The type and cost of parking ticket machines;

Managing income and VAT implications; Dealing with parking offenders; The area of land involved including the rights of SWW and Western Power as both have equipment in and adjoining the car park.

What might happen to the car park if the Parish Council do not take it over.

Parish Councillors would like your views on this matter, which could be one of the greatest decisions that the Parish Council is faced with for many years. You can do this by writing to or emailing the Clerk or any Parish Councillor or posting your comments on www.lympstone.org.

Lympstone Pre-school have applied for funds to build a new building at the village hall to secure their future. They need help in raising more funds to add to those that are included in the grant application. You may have seen their invitation to get involved. The Parish Council will discuss this at their next meeting on 16th November. Come along and hear what is happening and support this vital Group that works so hard to prepare children for their future.

CHANGES COMING TO OUR TRAIN SERVICES

Our Avocet Line is now part of the Great Western Railway after a new franchise to



operate the trains started in September.

The franchise lasts for 4 (or possibly 5) years and the introduction of electric trains from Paddington to Bristol and South Wales and in the Thames Valley means we will see a number of major changes:

- Longer trains on our line normally 4 cars. GWR promise 51% more seats overall on local Exeter services
- Trains will be refurbished with new toilets and will be through-corridor
- Half-hourly trains from Exmouth will run through to Paignton vis Exeter Central and St Davids
- There will be more mainline trains and better connections..

Most of these changes will start in 2018, but there should be other, smaller improvements sooner. The parish council will support the Avocet Line Rail Users Group in its campaigns to get as many improvements as possible as soon as possible. 




