In December they were playing in The Royal Albert Hall's Verdi Restaurant. In March they will perform in Lympstone Village Hall, turned into a café atmosphere for the occasion, with a licensed bar of course. **FB Pocket Orchestra** takes its listeners back to the hot jazz, blues, ragtime & popular dances of the 1920/30s & earlier. "Atmospheric, yet vibrant," said Jazz FM, "this charming collection of songs will make you wish you had been born some 100 years ago. The style, glamour and 'fabulousness' of this era is captured beautifully by this band." Their latest album includes such popular favourites as *After You've Gone, My Heart Belongs to Daddy* and *On the Sunny Side of the Street.* "They led us through two hot 'n' swingin' sets of twenties and thirties 'birth of the blues' jazz music, from Ellington's theme for the Cotton Club to Bix Beiderbecke's *At the Jazz Band Ball.* Perfect playing and singing by some of the self-deprecating heroes of the early jazz scene." STOLEN VIOLIN TO BE PLAYED IN LYMPSTONE

Krysia Ostostowicz, founder of the renowned Dante Quartet, whose stolen violin was recovered when someone tried to pawn it, will be playing her £200,000 instrument in Lympstone, when the Dantes, at the invitation of Lympents, will perform all of Beethoven's string quartets in our village in May and June.



Krysia was returning home after broadcasting on BBC Radio 3 last July, when she put down her violin outside Brixton tube station to unlock her bike. The 300 year old instrument was snatched in seconds. Next morning, she visited countless musical businesses, junk shops and pawn shops, telling them what had happened and leaving her phone number. "I knew somebody might try and sell it," said Krysia, a professor at the prestigious Guildhall School of Music. "It's like my voice," she added, "I lost my voice." The violin, made in Venice in 1720, has been used to record more than 30 of her albums and has toured with her for over 20 years. Two mornings later she had a phone call from the manager of Cash Converters in Streatham to say that a woman was trying to pawn a violin for £50. The police were called, and Krysia was eventually reunited with her precious instrument – after the police had impounded it as evidence.

Krysia, her violin, and the other members of the Dante Quartet will be playing in Lympstone on the first weekend of May and the first weekend of June 2017. In six concerts, they will perform all of Beethoven's string quartets, some of the finest ever written. Also present will be Beethoven himself (in the person of the experienced television actor David Timson), to introduce his music, and tell the audience how each of these quartets fitted into his famously turbulent life.
