PARISH COUNCIL

The Annual Parish Meeting was held on Monday 3rd April 2017. This is not a Parish Council meeting but a meeting of all the electors in the Parish and anything relating to the Parish may be discussed.

Cllr Chris Carter chaired the meeting (as he must do if he is present.). He opened the meeting with his report for The Parish Council had the vear. organised two successful verv celebrations for Her Majesty's 90th Birthday. A hugely welcome beacon bonfire party was held in Cliff Field during April. This was organised by Cllr Peter Acca and Clerk, Tony Le Riche with food and a bar put on by the Scouts. This was their fund raising event and we hope that they did very well out of it. The second celebration was a full-on community party in Candy's Field in June. This was organised mainly by Cllr Jenny Clark and members ofthe

Neighbourhood Plan Projects Group. This raised £2,000 for the general funds of Lympstone Pre-school. This event also finished with an amazing fireworks display. The Parish Council's thanks go to Richard and his team at Angelfire.

PCSO Justin Wills attended the meeting and reported on policing in the area. He is under great pressure as he now covers Exmouth, Budleigh Salterton and the rural areas around these towns as far north as Clyst St Mary. WPCSO Sarah Trayhurn was our local PCSO but she has been on sick leave for some time. When she returns to work it will be on office duties for a while before she is able to get back to the parish. We wish her a successful recovery.

The Parish Council business continued as usual but there have also been three public meetings this year dealing with:

The Exmouth Sports Pitch Strategy which was trying to put new pitches in Lympstone for Exmouth Sports Clubs. The Parish Council will resist this as strongly as possible.

The planning application for the Dinan Way link road. The Parish Council put in strong objection to this road which will be built entirely in the Parish but is designed to overcome a difficulty little local for some residential areas in Exmouth. The National Trust and Historic England also put in strong objections and it was hoped that the Government would 'call-in' the application but eventually they decided not to and so DCC granted itself permission to build this road. Fortunately, there is no money for this and Parish and District Councillors will be looking closely at how funds might be raised for this project which is unwelcome in Lympstone.

The location of a new building for Lympstone Pre-school. DCC has secured funding to build a new modular building in Candy's Field. This was first discussed about 18 months ago when there was a clear wish for the building to go next to the Youth Club took DCC some

have now agreed and a planning application is now being prepared. The area that is required is larger than thought first as it needs accommodate the building, an outdoor canopied area for play and a garden. This means that the Youth Shelter, basket swing and MUGA will have to be moved. The Youth Club Leader. Eddie Mingo had said some time ago that the shelter could be dismantled as it served no useful purpose anymore and so this will be moved shortly, at cost to the Parish Council. Moving the basket swing and creating a new MUGA will be expensive so Cllr Rob Longhurst is now actively seeking funding for this as well as continuing his fundraising for the community contribution towards the cost of the new building.

The Parish Council also met on Monday 3rd April 2017. Mrs Judith Carter reported on matters relating to the Exe Estuary Trail. The longawaited stick-on cobbles had now been laid around the lower village and these would now be monitored to assess their effectiveness. There has been some initial reaction but it is important to see how they fare in the long-run. The speed hump on Station Hill has received some comment notably that it is on the wrong side of the road but this is aimed at keeping cyclists on the correct side of the road rather than being a hindrance to those going up the hill. New options for persuading to use this location but reporting incidents are to be put in place to make it easy for anyone to report any near miss. Signs will be displayed informing everyone how to report. There will be more about this in the next edition. The next step in achieving an off-road route is to find £11.5k to fund survey works between the consulting Engineers and Network Rail. Mrs Carter and the Trail Group are looking at an Awards for All application but the time period involved is lengthy. There is a wide feeling that this project should be taken on by DCC as ultimately it will be a £1m + project and this is well outside the capability of the Parish Council but so far DCC have refused to get involved.

The Flood Group has met with the Environment Agency to discuss the next options for going some way towards alleviating flooding in the Parish. They are carrying out a flood modelling study on the feeder stream that joins the Wotton Brook at Pretty Corner. This will take two years to complete but should form a good basis for any works that might be In the meantime, the carried out. Parish Council has received informal approval to funding of £1,700.00 to carry out minor works to the upper reaches of the Wotton Brook with a view to holding water back during of heavy rain. times Local investigations will be led by Cllr David Atkins. THE CHAIRMAN'S YEAR

Monday the 3rd of April was the Annual Parish meeting. Unfortunately it was not well attended but it did present a couple of rare opportunities. Firstly we had the presence of a Police Support Officer who did his best to explain why we rarely saw a PCSO as our village. The likely halving of PCSOs numbers probably explains why the PCSO who came to our meeting is covering villages over a fifty mile radius.

The meeting provided the opportunity to report on some highlights of the Parish Council's work over the last twelve months.

Two projects I was involved in were rather unpleasant being the regular detection and deletion of graffiti in the toilets in the car park and the tracing of those allowing dog fouling involved me regularly looking for offenders and taking pictures as evidence. An increase in the number of dog waste bins seems to have reduced the numbers of offenders in Candy's Field but the graffiti still occasionally occurs.

The Environment Agency replacement of the brook flood walls and footbridge in the car park was finally finished late in 2016. I attended a number of meetings on the matter - lately to find out why it took so long for the new bridge to be installed

In April 2016 the whole of England held a bonfire night to celebrate the Queens birthday. Cllr



Acca and Tony le Riche organised much of the festivities. With food, drink, live music and fireworks half the village attended and a good time was had by all.

May 2016 saw me elected as chairman for a 2nd year and The Annual Art Show which I attended to show my support.

The 11th of June was the Village Party to celebrate the Queen's Birthday. Organised by my deputy, Cllr Jenny Clark, the events ran from Friday to Sunday and ranged from free ice cream to quilting with music and cross dressing and many other events.

- mainly in Candy's field. Both An open meeting at the end of June heard how East Devon officers had decided that Lympstone's Green Wedge would provide playing fields for the use of the people of Exmouth. I organised the meeting and got the people of Lympstone to show how they felt about this proposed use of our green wedge for sports pitches (last month it was announced that they have found a site in Exmouth for these).

> July and August saw Cllr Corcos, a new member of the Parish Council. take the management development of the Village Website with only a small amount of arm twisting from me.

> September saw the Beating of the Bounds (a four yearly event). I make no excuses for not joining this trek around the village owning to a naff In September Cllr Longhurst knee. joined the efforts of the Pre-school group to raise cash for a Preschool building and to have the Youth Club building replaced.

> October saw the start of a series of meetings to discuss the Dinan Way Extension with our Parish Council expressing their strong concerns. The meetings with DCC officers which I attended along with National Trust and other interested parties have apparently been ignored as DCC are proposing to go ahead with their original, unamended plans Wotton Brook taking all the rainfall from the new road. This is likely to

increase the risk of flooding in the village.

In November the village held an open meeting on the Dinan Way Extension. The DCC officers who attended presented the same well worn arguments that have been around for a long time (The Blue Route was apparently discussed some twenty vears before.) The Trail which has been Action Group discussing the problems caused by having the Estuary Trail running through the centre of Lympstone but had made some progress in November and December identifying a possible alternative route alongside the railway line.

In February 2017 the PC heard that it £400 to is likely that Lympstone will receive a grant to build the new Pre-school. The Council have confirmed where the new building would be on Candys Field, alongside the Youth Club and that they would clear the site. Late in another open March there was meeting, this time to agree the new location for the Multi Use Games Area, (MUGA) and swing and this was quickly passed on to DCC. At the time of writing, apparently DCC has not put in a planning application for the new building. With less than six months before it is hoped the building will be ready for occupancy at the start of September this is a very Merle Wheeler tight timescale.

This vear I have attended approximately eighteen Parish Council meetings plus a similar number of external meetings ranging from meetings with DCC Engineers to presentations and attending the Royal Marines Officers Mess, my year as Chairman of Lympstone Parish Council have been both demanding and rewarding.

EXE ESTUARY TRAIL NEW METHOD FOR REPORTING ACCCIDENTS AND NEAR MISSES



Many of you will have seen the strips of low impact cobbles at strategic places along The Strand and Sowden Lane. These were recommended by Devon County Council as a method of improving safety for all by reducing speed of cyclists and cars approaching bends and dangerous junctions. The rubber hump that has been placed on Station Hill is to encourage cyclists coming down the Hill to keep to the correct side of the road as they approach the junction. We do not know whether these measures (installed for free by DCC) will improve safety and we have agreed we will monitor how they work. The Parish Council agreed with DCC that if they did not improve safety they could be removed. It is therefore important to collect data about Accidents and Near Misses. A log book has been kept in Central Stores for recording Accidents and Near Misses but this is only known to residents and is not often used. We are therefore introducing a new method for reporting using the Village website and/or mobile a phone number 07542 404258 or www.lympstone.org To make visitors

and residents aware of this some signs will be placed on the route through the Village. If you have comments you wish to make about the cobbles, please email judith carter@hotmail.com However these measures do not reduce the need for an alternative safe route through Lympstone, alongside the railway line, as agreed in the Neighbourhood Plan.

HISTORY SOCIETY TALK

Todd Gray 'Name Calling in Devon'.

This month's talk by Exeter historian Dr Todd Gray is a fascinating insight into the historic art of the insult in Devonshire. Todd has written two books on the subject - 'Strumpets & Ninnycocks', and 'How to Swear like An Elizabethan in Devon'.

Slander cases are the only documents which recorded Devonians' speech verbatim. We hear the local usage of Elizabethan language including which insults were used and begin to understand how women were insulted differently than men. Some terms, such as cucumber and nippy, appear to have only been recorded as being used in Devon.

STOLEN VIOLIN TO BE PLAYED IN LYMPSTONE

All of Beethoven's String Quartets

May 5th 6th & 7th, June 2nd, 3rd & 4th Lympstone Parish Church

One of Britain's leading musical groups, The Dante Quartet, will be in Lympstone on the first weekends of May and June to play all of Beethoven's string quartets in six concerts. They will be accompanied by Beethoven himself (impersonated by television actor David Timson) who will relate the quartets to the composer's tempestuous life, using Beethoven's own words.

Krysia Ostostowicz, the founder of the Dante Quartet, hit the national headlines last summer when her £200,000 violin was stolen at Brixton tube station. It was recovered a few days later, when somebody tried to pawn it at Cash Converters in Streatham. Happily she will be playing her 300-year-old Venetian violin in Lympstone.

This is a rare opportunity to hear all the Beethoven quartets, which are recognised as some of the finest music ever written. A season ticket is available if you want to hear them all, a once-in-a-lifetime experience, but of course you can also choose to come to a selection of the concerts, promoted by Lympstone Entertainments.


