Rory Estcourt has Cllr resigned from the Parish Council as his work commitments, which include a great deal of travel around the country, have increased. Parish Council Chairman, Cllr Chris Carter paid tribute to his work since he joined the Parish Council a few years ago. The vacancy will now be advertised on the Notice Boards. The Parish Council can co-opt a new councillor unless 10 electors request EDDC to hold a formal election, the cost of which (more than £1000!) is met by the Parish Council. The Parish Council will consider all expressions of interest before making a decision Cllr Carter said there is much work for the Parish Council to do and so another active member would be most welcome

Council tax for 2016/17. The Parish Council has now set its budget for the next year. The full budget can be found on the website under Parish Council —

Accounts. The Parish Council tax for a Band D property will increase by £6.06p for the year or 50.5p per month. The rise in other parishes is much greater and this small increase will make sure that the Parish Council has funds to meet its needs and is able to react to unforeseen situations. Big areas of spending include making contributions towards a new facility for Lympstone Pre-school, continuing the improvements and updating Lympstone Youth Club, building up a fund to meet the Parish Council's commitment to resurfacing the major portion of the Village Hall car park. There is also a fund to help meet the cost of community projects that are included in the Lympstone Neighbourhood Plan.

Dinan Way extension. Your Parish Council Chairman and other Councillors met have County Councillor Hughes and DCC Officers to express concerns that the proposed route of this road has been changed to meet an objection by the National Trust and Historic England, without giving residents a chance to have their views on the new route. Explanations and re-assurances are being requested. The proposed road will be built entirely in Lympstone but is not perceived to bring any improvement to residents. It may bring benefits to the people of Exmouth and Woodbury but the actual route will not affect them at all. Legal action has been threatened by Cllr Rob Longhurst if there is not more consultation and the views of residents are given the weight that they deserve.

FLOOD ACTION GROUP



The Methodist Hall was full to capacity on Saturday 9th January for an event organised by the Parish Council flood

action group. Cllr Helen Dimond had representatives invited from Environment Agency and DCC's prevention team to meet parishioners and a wide ranging discussion on flooding was held. Some 50 parishioners attended along with Environment Agency representatives, one rep from DCC, 6 Parish Councillors and the Parish Clerk.

The Environment Agency explained what is in place within the village to prevent flooding and Jane Fletcher-Peters (who has been working closely with the PC group) brought samples such as door gates, air-brick seals, toilet blocks etc. Assistance can be provided to anyone who wishes to develop their own personal flood action plan. Cllr Dimond is happy to coordinate a project for those who wish to fit flood boarding to their homes in order to get a group rate on the cost.

Alan Child presented excellent video footage of flooding along Underhill (December 2015) and many others spoke of specific issues they had experienced. Key areas of concern are Underhill (and residents of Church Path), Pretty Corner, debris under bridges on the Wootton Brook, the lower screen becoming clogged too easily and those with gardens abutting the brook not being aware of their responsibilities to keep the brook clear of debris

It also seems that water run-off to Pretty Corner has become significantly more since installation of the Coombe Farm solar farm and a discussion was held about run off from such installations. It was felt by many that the planning authorities are not fully involving the Environment Agency in assessing floodwater run-off for new developments.

Flooding in Lympstone is certainly not a simple issue - nearly all flooding that has occurred in the past has been the result of water rising from the Wootton Brook and its Services produce leaflets about some

of specific flood prevention items catchment area rather than water ingress to the village from the estuary. It was explained that the causes of flooding are many and various higher land management, farming practices, build-up of debris in the brook and lack of maintenance (ditches, holding tanks, culverts and gullies) can all be contributory factors. Options were discussed such as putting a community gauge on the Wootton Brook to give advanced warning to parishioner of sudden rises in water levels.

> This meeting was geared mainly at tackling issues should a flood occur this is just the first of many meetings and events the PC flood action group are planning. It was agreed that much more work needs to be done to deal with the wider implications.

> Cllrs Helen Dimond, David Young and Jenny Clark would be very happy to hear from any parishioner with input, photos or video footage of flooding so that a comprehensive picture can be maintained.

FLOODING AND YOU

Many of us are concerned about flooding in our village - its causes and effect on our lives. But given its extent, spreading and deepening. perhaps we all should take action now to limit its direct cost. Environmental aspects of flooding and many commercial suppliers and services encourage you to take action and offer specific remedies, but think about what you could do to limit the impact on you and your home.

Flood gates to stop the rising sea were installed a decade ago and high walls to constrict the stream were similarly built quite a while ago. But neither can be built high or strong enough in the long term. Further flooding is therefore sadly inevitable! This article attempts to show how you can minimise the effects of flooding in and around your house.

Obviously the key issue is to preserve life. Early warning of possible flooding can be obtained by text or email from the Environment Agency. However the brook levels can change very quickly and you may only have 30 minutes warning.

Have a plan of what you will do if you expect to be flooded. This should include what to isolate from the water such as items to be taken upstairs. what to turn off (electricity can short and start fires) and those items which you cannot move like heavy kitchen equipment and furniture. Also, it is useful to identify where you can move to in the short term such as an accommodating friend living on higher ground.

Before you expect to be flooded think about sealing the house (water can enter through doors, windows and air bricks, meant to allow airflow under floors, and cat flaps). Special bricks to stop water ingress can be purchased as can removable drain covers. Covers for low level letterboxes and other flaps are mainly design features. Wall coverings, plaster boards and skirting boards, often have to be removed if allowed to get wet and then replaced. Electrical wiring and plugs need to be repositioned above possible water levels, not cheap, and wall coverings need to be replaced.

D. Flood-resilient or 'wet-proofed' buildings

But doing this at a convenient time is always going to be cheaper than having to do this after

flooding. Several waters-edge properties such as those in Quay Lane have been 'tanked' and wiring moved to a few feet off the floor by residents who have planned for water ingress.

Boards which have slots by front doors are not as effective as might be imagined but are better than sandbags which have their own storage problems when not in use.

Cables for telephone and data (broadband) should always be installed above possible water levels. Floor covering like carpets will probably have to be discarded if allowed to get wet.

Lastly and quite importantly, when abandoning your house leave a prominent note by the door saying where you have gone.

EXE ESTUARY TRAIL

Unfortunately we have had response from Nigel Flower of Devon County Council to our queries about when proposed cobbles will be laid since he visited the village in October. In December the Trail Action Group wrote to DCC with a request for an update on what support they would provide on the need identified in our Neighbourhood Plan for an off road route for the Exe Estuary Trail Lympstone. through The kev objective in the Neighbourhood Plan is to ensure the development of a new route for the EET through Lympstone in consultation with interested parties, providing an easier and quicker route for commuter cyclists, sport cyclists, and cycling groups, and a safer route for families with young children; protecting the special character of the village; providing a good quality experience visitors; for maximising the benefits for local businesses

We got a response from David Whitton, DCC Head of Highways who placed responsibility for any progress on Lympstone Parish Council. He stated that the off-road route is "not deliverable for technical reasons" and "not affordable for DCC to construct given currently available & foreseeable levels of funding". He went on to suggest that Lympstone Parish Council should develop the

route into a viable proposition, consider how it could be funded, and get permission from Network Rail. We were also sent copies of initial drawings which DCC drew up 10 years ago which showed how the Trail could be routed alongside the railway line from Sowden End to Lympstone Station, Network Rail have told us that there are a number of possible option of how the Trail could be routed in the railway cutting but until a proper survey is done they would not be able to give their permission to go ahead. In order to make any progress LPC will need to get a survey done of the options with an estimate of costs and get approvals from Network Rail. We will therefore have to raise the money to do this and seek Community and/or Cycling Funding initially to carry out a survey and then to build the Trail. Our next steps are to identify an appropriate surveyor and estimate the cost of carrying out a survey so that we can apply for Grant Funding to do this.

Parish Council is seeking volunteers to help with the delivery of different aspects of the Neighbourhood Plan. I am working with group deliver development of the off road route for the Exe Estuary Trail. If anyone is interested in joining this group Please email judith carter@hotmail.com


