The Environment Agency is to replace the footbridge at Underhill Car Park.

Contractors on behalf of the Environment Agency will start work to replace the footbridge across the Wotton Brook at the car park on Monday January 11. The bridge is in a poor condition and is being replaced with a new one. Works are expected to last up to 12 weeks.

One of the contractor's first tasks will be to create a temporary bridge to maintain pedestrian access throughout the works and to allow contractors access to both side for working. However, this means that up to 15 of the 84 car parking spaces will be taken up by the work during the 12-week contract period and residents – some of whom are car park permit holders – are being warned that car parking spaces may not be easily available. Lymptone residents who park their vehicles at Underhill Car Park are being warned that essential works to the pedestrian footbridge next month will mean fewer parking spaces for up to 12 weeks.

Andrew Ennis, East Devon District Council's Service lead for Environmental Health and Car Parks, apologised to the public for the inconvenience.

He said: "We are told by the Environment Agency that the work needs to be carried out urgently for public safety and it is unavoidable.

We are doing everything we can to minimize disruption in the car park. Information boards will be displayed in the car park over the coming weeks and cars will be leafleted to ensure that everyone knows what is happening."


MONKEY!

OF SHOES AND SHIPS AND SEALING WAX...

Did you find a copy of *The Shops of Lympstone* in your Christmas stocking? No? Then rush out now to Lympstone's remaining shop and spend £6 of your Christmas money on the village's newest best-selling book.

Lympstone used to be full of shops. In the 1970s, Alfred Langmead was asked to take a trip through the village in his mind's eye, remembering the shops of his childhood, before the First World War. With this as her starting point, Angela Coles has used her own extensive research to tell the story of the shops and shopkeepers who made it possible to live here before most people had cars.

Here is Glad Hawkins, selling fruit and fireworks, and Gwen Hatt with her sweet shop at the bottom of School Hill, Old Chick brewing beer at the Railway Inn, Hodge's bread and Ware's dairy, Tozer's for your paraffin, Foxwell's for your coal, bootmakers and barbers and butchers and a bookshop.

Here too are the trades of Lympstone, blacksmiths and boat building, lacemaking and lime burning, and most of all fishing, now returned to this traditional fishing village thanks to The Compass Rose, whose catch Jason sells at the Old Fish Shed.

The book is illustrated with over 50 period photographs, and has an evocative Foreword by Robert Harrison, who remembers his own childhood in the 1950s, and the shops where he was sent to by his mother, or where he spent his pocket money – "I can picture now the dusty wooden floor and dark wood counter, and many cardboard boxes scattered about with fruit and veg, and amongst those somewhere was Smokey, Glad Hawkins's Persian Blue cat."


