PARISH COUNCIL Draft Exmouth **Sports Pitch Strategy**

The Village Hall was full at the Public Meeting, 29th June, 7.00 pm when this Strategy of EDDC was discussed Plowden Charlie and Graeme Thompson of EDDC explained the strategy in detail and suggested that two sites in Lympstone, at Courtlands Lane and Hulham Road were the best sites available to meet the growing need for sports pitches for Exmouth. The Parish Council did not agree with this suggestion and their view was wholeheartedly supported by residents on the night. A full response with other suggestions has now been sent to EDDC. The full response can be found on the website.

The Parishes Together Fund was set up by DCC and EDDC to provide funds equivalent to £1.10p per elector for projects to be carried out by two or more Parish Councils. In the past this has provided funds for improvements in Cliff Field and the route between the

School and Candy's Field. Last year the scope of the fund was widened to include works to improve land drainage. Lympstone Parish Council was successful in a bid for funds to raise the bridge over the Wotton Brook at Pretty Corner. All approvals are now in place and so we are ready for the contractor for the works, Dave Tyrrell, to say when he will be doing it.

This year, the Parish Council are investigating the installation of another screen higher up the Brook to trap some of the larger items that block the screen at the Bridge in Chapel Road.

There are regular meetings of the Chairman and Clerks of the nearby Parish Councils. At the last meeting a couple of weeks ago this Fund was the main item for discussion when it was suggested that the purchase of marquees and a mobile PA system considered. could also be This equipment would be available for several Parishes to use. Exmouth Town Council will investigate. Cont

The Parish Cemetery

Parish Council The has been considering ways of dealing with the waste at the Cemetery. This is a mix of compostable and non-recyclable The bins are not emptied waste. regularly and have become an evesore in what should be an area of peace and tranquillity. This has been discussed informally with members of the VHMC and it has been agreed that:-

The existing wheelie bins and the compost area are removed from the cemetery and the area is tidied and planted with shrubs.

Outside the cemetery, it is proposed that the hedge and trees are cut back to the original boundary right down to ground level.

A new compound is created to contain the Village Hall waste bins and one wheelie bin for all cemetery waste.

A contract is set up with EDDC to empty this along with the other waste bins at the Village Hall.

The above should bring about an improvement of the cemetery and the Village Hall. The work will be carried out by the Parish Council Handyman so the direct cost will be low. By clearing the overgrown hedge and trees, there will be no loss of parking spaces once the work is finished.

EXMOUTH LAND GRAB

Last week's open meeting indicated how little the Lympstone Neighbourhood Plan has been noted by East Devon District Council. After surveying the diminishing space left in Exmouth for playing fields EDDC officers have decided that the Green Wedge between us and Exmouth was ideal for a series of games pitches. They suggested that they might use a Compulsory Purchase Order if necessary and that if the land is not made into playing fields it would end up being built on. This offended me as it ignored how we have defended our land in the past.

The full hall politely listened and questioned the EDDC presentation, followed by Lympstone Football Club saying how much they needed space. But it was pointed out that Lympstone needed other spaces like a cricket ground. Cllr Ingham showed a good defence of our Green Wedge and Cllr Longhurst expressed regret at the possible loss of the Green Belt he fought so hard for three years ago although he saw the need for pitches.


