# IMPORTANT MEETING 29/6/16



The ED Local Plan and the Lympstone Neighbourhood Plan clearly state that there should be no coalescence between Exmouth and Lympstone and use of these areas for pitches designated for Exmouth would seem to lead to that. One can easily imagine the names of Exmouth Clubs on buildings and pitches with an Exmouth name but lying in Lympstone. This would be unacceptable.

More importantly, both these areas form a crucial part of the surface water drainage system for significant areas of land. These then drain into feeder streams and the Wotton Brook. Any development of these areas could have significant impact on flooding in Lympstone and this wider view needs to be taken into account in considering possible development of these areas for any purpose.

More money for community projects Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) has now been set up by EDDC with effect from 1st September 2016. Under this levy developers will have to pay £125 per gross square metre of any new house that they build. The money is collected by EDDC from when the house is first occupied but

Councillors and the clerk to get on 25% of any money collected for new houses in Lympstone, will come to the Parish Council. This money as its name implies, is pay community infrastructure of any kind. The Parish Council has informed EDDC that it would wish the money to be spent on the projects that are Lympstone listed in the Neighbourhood Plan. No doubt, EDDC will also have its own ideas for spending this money. One option that is open to them comes from the Exmouth Sports Pitch Strategy. This is aimed at providing more much needed playing pitches for sports for Exmouth but two of its prime target sites are in Lympstone. meeting to debate this will be held in the Lympstone Village hall starting at 7pm on Wednesday the 29<sup>th</sup> of June.




