Welcome back to Parish Council Chairman, Cllr Chris Carter after his operations to help his knees. Jenny Clark stepped in as Vice-Chairman and has made sure that work towards the new Pre-school building continued apace and was thanked by the Parish Council for her sterling work. Cllr Chris Carter is now on the mend and able to play a major part again. He has spoken to many of the players in this scenario and has got answers to some of the obstacles that were being highlighted. There is still work to do but the Parish Council hopes that the obstacles are getting fewer and smaller.

**Greater Exeter Strategic Plan Consultation** The local authorities of East Devon, Exeter, Mid Devon Teignbridge in partnership with Devon County Council are working together to prepare a Greater Exeter Strategic Plan (GESP). This formal statutory document will provide the overall spatial strategy and level of housing and employment land to be provided 2040. Please visit up to www.gesp.org.uk for more information. . When adopted, it will sit above Local Plans for each area which will continue to be prepared to consider local level issues. It will also sit above Neighbourhood Plans.

Engagement with stakeholders and communities will be critical to the success of the new Plan. At this first stage, the authorities are consulting on an initial 'issues document' which, after setting out some background information, looks to explain the scope and content of the plan as well as describing the key issues facing the Greater Exeter area. This early stage consultation is designed stimulate debate and the local planning authorities are seeking your views on the scope and content of the plan as well as the key issues facing area. A number of other associated documents are also being consulted on including. Statement of Community Involvement (SCI) This sets out the approach for consultation in the GESP setting out the way in which communities and other interested parties will be engaged throughout the process.

The consultation runs from 27 February 2017 until 10 April 2017. To view the consultation material and to make your comments please visit www.gesp.org.uk/consultations/issues A 'call for sites' has also been arranged to run alongside the consultation. This

allows interested parties to submit potential sites for development to the Local Authorities. The sites are then assessed to consider whether they are suitable for possible inclusion in the plan. Further information is http://gesp.org.uk/call-for-sites/.

A site can be suggested for housing development if it is capable of accommodating at least 5 dwellings or measures at least 0.15 hectares. A site can be suggested for economic development if it measures at least 0.25 hectares or is capable of providing at least 500m2 of floor space.

This new Plan and the call for sites could affect the contents of the Lympstone Neighbourhood Plan. The Parish Council will need to keep a close eye on this and if necessary will have to consider starting a review of the Lympstone Neighbourhood Plan.

Mothering Sunday is 26th March this year. At the 10:00am Family Eucharist service posies will be distributed to all to take to their Mother or in loving remembrance of her.

Lent may originally have followed Epiphany, just as Jesus's sojourn in the wilderness followed immediately on his baptism, but it soon became firmly attached to Easter, as the principal occasion for baptism and for the reconciliation of those who had been excluded from the Church's fellowship. This history explains the characteristic notes of Lent – self-examination, penitence, self-denial, study, and preparation for Easter, to which almsgiving has traditionally been added.

The calculation of the forty days has varied considerably in Christian history. It is now usual in the West to count them continuously to the end of Holy Week (not including Sundays), so beginning Lent on the sixth Wednesday before Easter, Ash Wednesday.

THE LYMPSTONE EMERGENCY PLAN: REQUEST FOR VOLUNTEERS, INLAND FLOODING



The Parish Council Emergency Group is revising the Lympstone Emergency Plan. The PCEG recognises the two major flood risks are from the Estuary, and from inland flooding, primarily caused by the Wotton Brook

flooding in times of heavy and sustained rainfall, usually combined with a high tide. Estuary flood prevention measures are already in place with a team of wardens led by Alan Burton. They are well organised and effective group, utilising good and resources equipment. The however, same cannot be said of Inland Flooding, and a significant number of properties remain at risk, with no coordinated approach to the risk.

Although there was an Information Session held last month on Inland Flooding, we are still looking for volunteers to act as Inland Flood Wardens, and to work under the guidance of a Leader. Wardens would be involved in both preventative and maintenance work along the Brook, and also in response to emergency flood situations. In total, we would not expect the time required to exceed one or two days per year, but it is certainly the case that many hands will make light work!

#### PV SOLAR PANELS

I have previously reported about Solar Energy in the Herald. Recently many solar panel owners have been contacted by a firm from Bristol with HQ in S Wales about 'Solar Edge' technology developed in the USA.

In simple terms solar panels work like old Christmas tree lights, if one goes out they all go out. If one panel is in shadow then all panels behave as if they are in shadow too. This system wires the panels in parallel and all panels work independently so shadow on one makes no difference to the others. The system also reports back via WiFi to tell the performance of each panel so you know when one fails and needs replacing. They are supposed to give performance in low light.

I decided to consult Chris Rudge, the local supplier, from whom I bought a panel in 2010. (I am NOT on commission unfortunately) He quoted a price which was two thirds of the other firm for almost the same service (they promised to monitor the panels.) So far it is early days but I asked a friend how the winter performance had gone and was told it was not a sunny winter. surprised because for us it was as good a result as I have ever had so maybe they do work. The other point is that, because they are in parallel they are lower voltage and safer.

#### **ROYAL MARINES LIFT**

Royal Marines from Lima Company 42 Cdo, currently deployed on HMS Ocean in the Gulf, are taking part in a humongous challenge which will see them 'Lift' the 21473 tonne weight of the ship and 'Shift' it the 10,000km distance it will travel from deployment to home port in Plymouth. This mammoth challenge will be completed by just 100 men in 24 days!

The 'Lift & Shift' challenge is kick starting the 'Royal Marines 1664 Global Challenge' which will see 100 challenges completed in 100 days to raise much needed funds for the Royal Marines Charity. This challenge is particularly poignant for the men of 42 Cdo RM as the charity is currently supporting their friend, colleague Lympstone and local resident Matt Drake in his long rehabilitation for changing life injuries sustained after an accident on deployment. #### **EXE ESTUARY TRAIL**

In response to Lympstone's residents concerns regarding safety on the route which links the Exe Estuary Trail using Sowden Lane and The Strand. DCC have finally confirmed that, "they will be making carriageway improvements over Monday 27th and  $28^{th}$ March. Tuesday of These improvements will allow for the speed of cyclists to be reduced to safer communal use. along with encouraging cyclists to maintain their lane of travel. The works will include a bolt-down rubber road hump, minor road marking alterations, along with cobble rows using an innovative resin surfacing, emphasise to this community environment and to better guide cyclists. Access to properties will be maintained at all time, though brief road closures may be require." These improvements were agreed with the Parish Council over 18 months ago. The planned work includes the bolt down rubber ramp at the bottom of Station Hill on the left as you go up. This is to encourage cyclists to keep to the left as they come down the hill to the junction with The Strand: 3 rows of stick on cobbles across The Strand before the junction with Chapel Road; 3 bands of cobbles on Cox's Hill, Sowden Lane before the corner at Ouay Lane; a line of cobbles in the centre of the

road around the bend by the Estuary

Sowden Lane; and junction where the trail markings from Exmouth meets Sowden Lane. We hope that these measures will improve safety along the route as numbers using the trail are now at 500,000 a predicted and increase. to However these measures do not reduce the need for an alternative safe through TRAIL COURTESY route Lympstone. As agreed in the Neighbourhood Plan we' working are with the Parish Council to explore the feasibility and cost of a route alongside the railway line to provide an alternative route in particular for commuting cyclists those travelling through Lympstone and for parents with young children and babies in trailers. DCC's own Safety Audit recommends that parents with young children should not use the on However road sections. these concerns are not made clear to users. We are currently in discussions with Network Rail and in order to get a survey carried for a route alongside the railway line we are required to raise £5000 to pay to Network Rail in advance for permission to gain supervised access to the track to carry out the survey.






