Dog fouling in Candy's Field is still a problem. Did you realise that dogs should be kept on a lead in the Field? Not

many people do but there is a dog control order to this effect. The Dog Warden can and will issue an on-thespot fine of £80 to anyone who does not keep their dog on a lead. The same fine can be issued for not picking up after your dog. The Dog Warden visited last month and is proposing to make more visits in future. She met a dog walker in the field with a black collie dog, old in age and this dog was not on a lead, when she approached her and asked if she was aware the area was a dog on lead area, she replied ves, but no one keeps their dog on a lead here, all dogs are allowed to run free. The dog walker was advised that in general EDDC can serve a fixed penalty for £80 for not keeping a dog on a lead, however, the usual approach is to educate the first time and if they are caught a second time then a fixed penalty can be served. The dog walker said it is not very clear that the field is a 'dog on lead' area, the signage is very poor, and therefore not many people would understand. There are signs at the main entrances to the Field and dog waste can be

deposited in a special dog waste bin or in any litter bin. There is one on Candy's Field on the way to Trafalgar Road and there will soon be one at the end of the path to Burgmanns Hill. There is no excuse for not using these bins.

POLICE WARNING

Police warning members of the public to be vigilant when buying items from advertising sites such free Gumtree. The warning comes after several incidents have been reported to police in the Exeter, Lympstone and Brixham areas. Suspects have been advertising white goods for sale on internet websites and delivering the items to customers. However, when the items are delivered they are not of the description that was advertised on the adverts

One Exeter woman had ordered a fridge from Gumtree and was left distressed after a man delivered an item wrapped in black plastic. Before the woman had chance to unwrap the package the suspect took the cash and drove off in a white transit van.

Police Constable Keith Bradshaw said: "When the victim removed the black plastic, the item was old, broken and worthless; possibly from a recycling centre. The suspects are keen to deliver goods right into the homes of victims and then leave quickly before the condition of the item can be seen. On one occasion a man from Brixham had a washing machine delivered to his home, whilst he was unwrapping the item to have a look at it, the suspect took the cash from the man's hand and drove off in a Ford transit van."

Reports have also been made of similar scams on Facebook 'buy and sell' sites. Police are asking people to report anything suspicious. 
Here's the "blurb" again to jog your memories. Limited seating so do get your tickets early!

"There was a dog walker in the field with a black collie dog, old in age and this dog was not on a lead, when I approached her I asked if she was aware the area was a dog on lead area, she replied yes, but no one keeps their dog on a lead here, all dogs are allowed to run free.

I advised the dog walker that in general we can serve a fixed penalty for £80 for not keeping her dog on a lead, however, my approach is to educate the first time and if they are caught a second time then a fixed penalty can be served. The dog walker said it is not very clear that the field is a dog on lead area, the signage is very poor, and therefore not many people would understand.

My main observation is that further entrances need clear signage showing dogs on lead area and I would suggest these are posted by the gate entrance to each section. The costs would have to come from the parish town council and not EDDC, so maybe this is something you could take up at a meeting in the near future. Then the constituents of Lympstone would

need to be informed in a newsletter that penalties will apply if they are witnessed with dogs off leads.


