REPORT TO ANNUAL PARISH MEETING FROM NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN GROUP APRIL 2016

Following the hugely successful referendum in March 2015, the group has met to plan the next steps.

It is pleasing to see that the presence of the Neighbourhood Plan has fended off some unwelcome predatory planning applications on the edges of the village and it appears that the statutory bodies are now applying it correctly in the planning review process.

The group wishes to rename itself The Neighbourhood Plan Implementation Group as it is deemed that our work will be to assist and enable local groups, organisations and businesses to flourish.

Obviously as we have one of the first 'made' neighbourhood plans in the

country it is difficult to gain experience from village's NP groups, and it appears that several are focussing solely on using their NP to pursue planning matters. However we feel that our NP was very well balanced between planning, community and environment and are confident that planning is covered well by the document - the Parish Councillors and other agencies are using it properly. It was therefore felt that the group's experience and energy could be best used by focussing more on the community and environment plans.

It is important to stress that the NPIG is not a team of volunteers with endless time and resources, who can rush in and pick up all the work! Our role is more to put people in need of project assistance in touch with relevant local people who have the skills to assist them. We are happy to attend a few initial meetings and set the ball rolling, but community actions need to be community driven – we are just one of many resources.

Over the past 12 months the following have been part of our work –

Work has been underway with the pre-school (assisting with business plans and project planning for a move to new premises)

Dialogue with Estuary Trail Group
Involvement with the fledgling Lymestone Community Foundation (a charity proposed to secure facilities and assets for the community).

The NPIG is running the Queen's 90th birthday party for the village on June 11th along with the PC and the pre-school committee.

Work is also underway on a new and modern-format guide to the village.

MORE SUNDAY TRAINS BETWEEN EXETER AND EXMOUTH FROM 15 MAY

Extra trains will run on Sundays between Exeter Central and Exmouth from 15 May and they will all call at



Lympstone Village station.

Trains will run every half hour through most of the day on Sundays throughout the year, instead of the previous hourly service.

Great Western Railway (GWR) is working with the Devon and Cornwall Rail Partnership and ALRUG (the Avocet Line Rail Users' Group) to encourage local residents to make the most of the extra Sunday services.

Ideas for what to do on a Sunday day trip by train can be found at a new website www.SeizeTheSunday.org. These include going for a Sunday roast at Topsham and other local "foodie" pubs and music nights out in Exeter and Exmouth. The Partnership is also helping promote travel by train

to some of the great local events this summer such as Exmouth Festival 27 May-5 June and Exmouth Kite Festival on 27 and 28 August.

Celia Minoughan, Project Officer at the Devon and Cornwall Rail Partnership said: "We encourage everyone to leave the car at home and enjoy a great day out by train. There's so much to do on a Sunday and it's great value too."

An adult Off Peak Day Return from Lympstone Village to Exeter Central is £4.30 and to Exmouth is £2.40. Under 5s go free and children aged 5-15 are half price.

WEEDKILLER SUBSTITUTE

Bristol City Council has started using vinegar as a weedkiller substitute. Residents have complained it is smelly and less effective on the



larger, more established weeds. Gillian Douglas, Council Interim Service Director for Clean and Green, said: “This trial of glyphosate free weed treatments is still in its early stages, having been implemented in response to widespread public concern about the use of glyphosate as a weedkiller.

ONE IN 11 ADULTS IS DIABETIC

One in 11 adults now have diabetes – with medics blaming obesity for the disease's rise. The World Health Organisation has seen a global surge from 108 million cases in 1980 to 422 million in 2014. 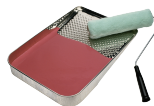

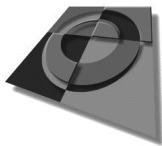
