PARISH COUNCIL

As many of you will have noticed, there have been County Council elections. There have been changes to the Warding and Lymington is now included in the Exmouth Ward, despite protestations that the name of the Ward should have been 'Exmouth, Lymington and Woodbury'. This Ward has two County Councillors and both are new as Bernard Hughes has stepped down after 24 years as a County Councillor. Bernard has been a good friend to the Parish and has given grants to many local groups as well as the Parish Council, but our view differed significantly over the Dinan Way link road.

Our two new County Councillors are Richard Scott and Jeff Trail. Both were able to come to the Parish Council meeting on 8th May 2017

and we look forward to working with them for the next four years.

Your Parish Council has a new Chairman and Vice Chairman. At the meeting on 8th May 2017, Cllr Chris Carter having completed his customary two years as Chairman, handed over the Chain of Office to Cllr Jenny Clark, who was elected unanimously by the Parish Council.

The Parish Council then held a ballot to elect a Vice-chairman for the year and Cllr Malcolm Lyon was elected. Malcolm led the Council on planning matters for a while before handing over to the reins to Cllr Helen Dimond who has a wealth of valuable experience, being a former planning and conservation officer. Malcolm is also a Trustee of the Lymptone Learning Alliance, which is leading the project to get a new Pre-school building for Lymptone.

Lymptone Pre-school building project continues but a little more slowly than planned. DCC have been given until the end of October to complete this project. A planning application for the building to go next door to the Youth Club in Candy's Field should be submitted in the next week or two. Cllr Rob Longhurst is still fundraising to meet the community contribution of £43,000



towards this project and he is now also fundraising to relocate the Multi Use Games Area in order to make room for the new Pre-school building. Rob needs information on which Groups and sports could make use of a new MUGA in order to support a funding application. Please get in touch if you think you can offer anything towards this.

IN LYMPSTONE

Excited audiences in Lymptone Church, gave standing ovations to the Dante Quartet at their first three Beethoven concerts. "I joined a packed audience for the second concert," said Roger Hendy, Chairman of Devon Performing Arts Festival, "and found the playing absolutely intoxicating." And there are three more to come, at the beginning of June – "which should not be missed!" he added.

The concerts are accompanied by a dramatic commentary by Beethoven himself, played by the actor David Timson, with a script by playwright Clare Norburn. "The ravishing playing of the Dante Quartet, combined with the convincing performance of the actor, resulted in an extraordinary experience for those of us fortunate enough to have been there," wrote Bridget Hugh-Jones, another member of the audience. "It will not easily be forgotten."

The event is organised by Lymptone Entertainments, who erected a stage in the church, and used theatre lights to help dramatize. Now ranked as one of Britain's finest quartets, the Dante are playing all 17 of Beethoven's string quartets over their two weekends in Lymptone, and still to come are the famous 'Harp' Quartet, the 'Serioso', and the great Grosse Fugue, on Friday, Saturday and Sunday, 2nd, 3rd and 4th June. 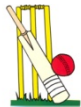
with Edward (David), not forgetting the power of the press, public opinion and Nazism.

SOUTH WEST WATER SEWERAGE WORKS IN LYMPSTONE.



As part of a larger investment in the region to reduce storm water overflows and improve the quality of

the estuary waters, South West Water will be increasing the capacity of the storm storage tanks in Underhill car park and making improvements to the storm water overflow by the Lime Kiln.

The scheme will involve the installation of an additional 600m³ storm storage tank in the car park, lining of some sewers in the area and improved screening on the storm water overflow to the estuary. Other options have been considered, including a new surface water system, but these have been ruled out following consultation with the local council and Environment Agency, due to the level of disruption with road closures and an increased risk of flooding with additional surface water discharges into Wotton Brook.

The dates have not been confirmed yet, but the work is expected to begin in the summer and construction of the tank will take around six months to complete. South West Water is looking at alternative car parking sites for the duration of the work and will hold a public information meeting nearer the time.

BLOG ON THE SHOREBIRDS OF THE ESTUARY

John G-C was a research biologist for 40 years with the Natural Environment Research Council, specialising on shorebirds



– waders and wildfowl – that occur on UK estuaries in the greatest numbers during the winter. From 1976 until he retired in 2002, the Exe estuary was where he and his team developed and tested their ideas: some of you may remember the tower hides that colonised the estuary for many years. He carried on this interest after retiring and is still active in research and a Visiting Professor in Ecology and Conservation at Bournemouth University.



He has spent the last few years testing

ideas on the significance – if any - to shorebirds of disturbance from people's activities on and alongside the estuary. He is now beginning a project on the implications for shorebirds of the massive loss of mussels that has occurred over the last few years on most of the intertidal mussel beds of the estuary. He has set-up a blog that he updates with the results of his research and thought that some people in the village might be interested to know of it. The blog address is:

A food emergency only arises if there is an underlying financial crisis. Modern society has created a complex maze of forms and procedures, so it is very important for clients to engage with experienced support agencies who can provide advice with budgeting and benefit claims.

If you feel you can help us to provide food for “those in need”, please consider giving an item from the list below and leave it in the *collecting box* which is at the back of the social area, in front of the notice board, in the church. The food collected in the box is taken to the larder on a Friday morning.

'truly inspirational' during her visit to film the BBC's Open Gardens series

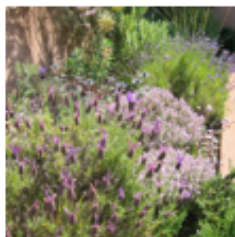
The garden is a wildlife friendly 2 acres, sitting with its toes in the Exe Estuary, featuring naturalistic seaside planting to create that washed up on the beach feel. It also has a mini meadow, ferny copse & sheltered Mediterranean courtyard garden to explore, with plenty of places to stop and take in the extensive views, estuary birdlife and salty air.

Cream teas will be served from The Boathouse pop up cafe' and there will be lots of lovely plants for sale alongside Love Local's quality crafts & gifts. There is a giant sandpit for children with buckets & spades provided and a photographic display showing how the garden has been lovingly developed out of the once derelict shellfish factory.



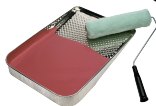
