PARISH COUNCIL

Are you registered to vote?: Did you know that people living in a fifth of the households in Lympstone may not be registered to vote? You will receive an Annual Canvass Form. Please fill it in and respond. The canvass form is not annual а registration form, but the information provided will enable us to send a separate individual registration form to all the people in your household who are eligible. Those who are eligible can also register online at gov.uk/registertovote. EDDC have posted out: 972 initial forms and 464 reminders. They have received 772 forms back from the Lympstone electorate (79.4% return)

They are chasing the last 20.6% of Lympstone electors for their forms. Make sure you register.

Help for Rural Energy Users. Citizens Advice is working with the Dept for Energy to provide advice and help to Groups in the community about the best deal for their energy. If you use oil for heating, they can advise you and others about setting up oil clubs so that you can all get the best price for your fuel. Dinan Way extension (cont)

DCC Consulted on two options for this route. Deep concerns were expressed by The National Trust and Historic England over the effect on A la Ronde, Point in View Church and associated Listed Buildings. These form a nationally important Group of properties and are within the top 3% of important properties in England. objections by the bodies Anv responsible for such properties must carry a great deal of weight. In determining a planning application or appeal and so a third option for the route was designed. This is the one that DCC are now proposing to submit. Details of this scheme can be found at

Your Parish Council has already that this road is pointed out constructed entirely in Lympstone Parish but will bring no benefit to residents. The Parish Council also expressed fears that surface water runoff for the new road will add significant quantities of water to the Wotton Brook which already cannot cope with the volumes of water it receives during times of heavy rain. At the first consultation meeting, there were no details of how surface water would be dealt with. DCC have now produced a drainage scheme which was the subject of a second consultation meeting on 3rd October

2016. A Draft plan of their proposals can now be found on the website www.lympstone.org. This includes an attenuation lake, roughly 60m X 20m, on the northern side, at the high point of the new road. This will contain water from the new road and land to the south and will release it more slowly into the Wotton Brook. The control mechanism uses а technique activated by water flow mechanical rather than valves. Unfortunately this will still allow water to flow into the Brook when it is already at full flow. The plan also includes an attenuation tank under the roundabout that is about 50m north of Courtlands Cross. This will also release water in the same controlled way using the same techniques and allow water to flow into the Brook when it is at full flow.

We asked if a drainage pipe can be included from the high point going towards Courtlands Cross so that water can then drain down to the River Exe using the existing drainage ditches that lie to the south side of Courtlands Lane. This would significantly reduce the volume of water flowing into the Wotton Brook. They have also asked if another attenuation tank can be constructed somewhere near the car park at The Saddlers Arms to take the water from the attenuation tank higher up the road and existing highway drainage. This would help to control the flow of water going into the feeder stream at

this point. This is still a draft plan with more work to be done. Your Parish Council will continue to emphasise the extra risks to flooding that this new road will bring and will press for measures to reduce this.

Sewerage in the Village is also of great concern. Cllr Rob Longhurst had noticed that raw sewage was being pumped into the River Exe in Lympstone. He is trying to find out how often this happens and what SWW are going to do to stop it happening. SWW contractors have spoken to Woodbury Parish Council to describe works that they are proposing to carry out to take surface water away from the combined drains in the Parish. This will reduce pressure on the sewerage system and should reduce or remove the number of sewage discharges into people's properties and the River Exe. The Parish Council has heard rumours of similar works in Lympstone and is keen to find out more.

HM The Queen's 90^{th} Birthday celebrations were a great success in the parish. The Parish Council has now heard from the organisers, Cllr Jenny Clark and Mrs Linda Lyon, that a substantial surplus was made on the day in June and so the Parish Council has been able to make a donation of £2,000 to Lympstone Pre-school. More fundraising continues and hopes are high that there will be a new building for the Pre-school next year.

Village organisations are urged to apply for a grant from the Parish Council. The Parish Council provides funds for this every year and your County Councillor also has a fund to give grants to support local clubs. So far an application has been approved for the Lympstone FC to have new equipment for its Youth section. There are applications from Lympstone Youth Club and Lympstone History Society but there are still funds available so if you think your Group could make use of some extra money, please contact Tony the Clerk for more help. 
