Clir Kathy Rogers was unanimously elected as Vicechairman of the Parish Council in place of Malcolm Lyon who has resigned as a Councillor to concentrate on work with the Lympstone Learning Alliance.

Parish Council Chairman, Cllr Jenny Clark reminded the meeting that Lympstone did not have a summer recess and there had been many significant and successful events in the Parish over the last two months. The Furry Dance and Annual Garden show were very successful as was the open gardens event which raised some £15000 for our local hospicecare.

The Open-Air cinema organised by Lympstone preschool was very successful with hundreds of children and adults enjoying the shows. See page 9 for more information.

A new traffic mirror had been provided at Sowden End to show traffic coming in the opposite direction. This was a Neighbourhood Plan Project aimed at improving road safety in that area and has been welcomed by motorists and cyclists.

Eddie and Lauren Mingo have decided to give up running the **Youth Club** after seven years. They have both done a wonderful job in keeping the Youth Club alive and active. Di Beatty has also stepped down from the Youth Club Committee having been associated with the Youth Club for nearly 40 years (Yes – 40!). The Parish Council thanks them for all their hard work. Interviews have been held for a new Youth Leader and it is hoped to make an appointment shortly. This leader will need to be supported by a team of ready, willing and able volunteers so if you have a child who might go to the Youth club or would like to get involved in this important part of Lympstone, please contact a Parish Councillor. The Youth Club cannot run successfully without your help. See page 20 for more info.

Ben Jones asked the Parish Council to consider providing a **skate park** for local children as he has had two near misses whilst skating in the village. The Parish Council was reminded that this had been consider about 6 years ago when it was felt that although this might be desirable, it would be expensive and difficult to locate due to the space required and noise that was generated. The Council agreed to pass this to the Neighbourhood Plan Projects Group to consider next year.

SWW works are now well underway in the Village. Regular updates are given on the website (www. lympstone.org). The new temporary car park has been well received and the Parish Council has been asked to look into keeping this when the works have finished. Parish Councillors would like to hear your views on this.

The new **Pre-school building** has taken a big step forward with planning permission being granted for the new building to go next to the Youth Club in Candy's Field. Putting the new building here means that the basket swing and the MUGA will have to be moved to the other side of the footpath towards the Rectory. This will mean the loss of the BMX track. Please be patient with any disruption during the construction work as the result will be a fantastic new facility for the Village.

Cllr Phil Corcos has been instrumental in bringing forward the **Environment Agency's** hydraulic survey of Wotton Brook. This will provide clear mapping and a fresh flood risk assessment. Hopefully this will also lead to more flood defences being constructed. These could be enhancing natural features to hold water back or installing mechanical features if needs be.

Vicky is the Practice Manager of Lympstone Pre School, mother of Addison (10) and married to Lee, a Royal Marine.

How did you come to live in Lympstone?

I moved to Lympstone 7 years ago with my husband and our son. On the day we moved into our house my dad died, so it was a very emotional time for me. Within a week, though, I felt so welcome and like I belonged here. A big part of that was my involvement in the preschool as Chairman of the Management Committee.

What is the best thing about Ilving in the village?

How busy and vibrant it is and the enthusiasm everyone has for everything! There is always something to do regardless of your interests and I love that everyone really gets behind the village events. This is particularly important to me as I organise a lot of fundraising events for the preschool and their amazing success would not be possible without the fantastic village support.

Describe your perfect day in Lympstone or Devon.

A perfect day for me has to be when I get the opportunity to go out walking! In training for our recent 'Marathon Walk' fundraiser, and for a 104 non-stop mile fundraising walk, a small team of friends and I walk 10-15 miles every Sunday. It's really made me appreciate what a beautiful village we live in! 



REVIEW OF PUBLIC FOOTPATHS AND RIGHTS OF WAY

At a public meeting at the Village Hall on Thursday 27th July, Alison Smith (Public Rights of Way Officer, DCC) launched the public consultation period for the review of footpaths and rights of way in the parish. This will continue until the end of September.

The aim is to establish the accuracy of the definitive map, which was established in conjunction with the Parish Council many years ago. You can view the definitive map for Lympstone on the DCC website at: www.devon. gov.uk/prow

The changes that can be made through the review process are

- add an unrecorded right of way
- upgrade or downgrade an existing right of way

 amend or delete something wrongly recorded

There are a couple of paths in the lower village which are regularly used as footpaths which are not recorded on the definitive map. One of these is the short stretch of footpath from The Strand to the car park which starts opposite Clays Cottages, the other is a short footpath to the estuary from Beach House to Searles, leading to one of the flood gates. Evidence is being collected about the use of these two paths but if you have regularly used these paths over a number of years please get in touch with the Parish Clerk on lympstonepc@gmail.com.

If there are other footpaths or bridleways of which you are aware that are not recorded or wrongly recorded please let the Clerk know.
