#### **DIGGING FOR OXFAM**

Flooding in Longmeadow Road has been the subject of major and well-warranted complaints from residents for some months. The unwelcome development by KD Homes has caused major disruption and damage to vehicles. A packed public meeting on 27th February 2018, attended by 90 people, heard firsthand accounts of the mess, damage and disruption that is being experienced every day. It is clear that the arrangements for dealing with surface water runoff from this site have not been dealt with properly and not in a timely manner. The planning permission did not require that the access route should be given a hard surface before any other deliveries or building work took place. So for cheapness, the access route is just mud made up of clay and gravel. It has been churned up every day during deliveries and building operations. Every day that it rains, brown, stony slurry runs off the site and down Longmeadow Road. The Planning permission also did not require surface water drainage measures to be put in place before deliveries and building operations started. these might have reduced the problems although some Parish Councillors and residents are convinced that the holding tanks that are to be provided to hold back surface water and release it slowly are nowhere near big enough to cope and so the water will still run off the site and into Longmeadow Road. The parish Council have now heard that SWW are going to grant permission for the holding tank to drain into the sewer that runs under Longmeadow Road. This is a combined sewer and so it takes sewage as well as rainwater. This is an 8" pipe and cannot cope during times of heavy rainfall at the moment. Adding extra water to the pipe will only make it fail more often. Cty Cllr Jeff Trail is on the case as this slurry is causing

damage to the highway and blocking highway drains. He has arranged for the DCC road sweeper to clear the road on occasions recently but the developer should be doing this. The Parish Council hopes that DCC are going to levy the full cost of this on KD Homes. Pressure is being put on the EA and SWW to get their act together to find a way of dealing with this problem before the sewer connection is made.

It is clear that there is an overriding problem relating to sewerage and surface water in Lympstone. The combined sewers and the surface water routes are clearly inadequate to cope and so Cty Cllr Richard Scott is looking to reach higher up in DCC, EA and SWW to discuss long-term solutions. Such works have taken place elsewhere and there is a strong case for new works in Lympstone.

Gulliford cemetery is looking better after a Work Party started to clear overgrown vegetation and trees from the site. More than 40 people turned up, some from as far away as Cullompton to get their hands dirty for this good cause. The walls and some of the tombs are listed and they are in poor condition. It was important to remove vegetation carefully to avoid damage but to see the extent of the repairs that are needed. The EDDC Conservation Officer has visited the Cemetery and has agreed that extensive works are needed. A surveyor from our community has volunteered to draw up a schedule of works which will then go to tender. Unfortunately the Gulliford Joint Committee has only a few hundred pounds and so some form of fundraising will be needed. It is not historic enough to warrant funding from the historic bodies and so it is essential that community activities are held at the cemetery in order to support grant applications. If you are involved in an art, music or drama Group or a young people's organisation please consider how you might hold an activity there to show community interest. Please get in touch with Tony, the Clerk to the Parish Council or Cllr Kathy Rogers with your ideas.

Blocked drains on the highway can cause problems. DCC has found an extra £100,000 to deal with this nuisance. If you know of a problem drain where there is standing water or water flowing over the drain but not into it, after 24 hours, please report this on the DCC website. 

## **CHRIS CARTER**

Born in Devon but raised in Yorkshire, Chris Carter returned to the South West on a sailing trip down the coast with his wife, Judith. They anchored on the Exe then discovered and fell in love with Lympstone.


My first home was an ancient cottage in Yealmpton with no electricity at the end of the 2nd World War where my grandparents had been shifted to allow the American Army to take over Blackawton village (including my mother's family home). Taken to Yorkshire before I could object and educated in a series of leaky huts, I somehow managed to pass my 11+ and get to grammar school. I spent the next four years in the uniformed branch of the AA then, after an accident disabled me, the AA moved me into computers in London in 1965 just in time to enjoy the swinging 60s. In 1973 I was married and had a daughter. We now have three lovely grandchildren who love to visit Lympstone.

I spent most of my life developing computer systems in business. My most interesting system was an enquiry programme called 'Pert for Pets' which I built in my own time and sold in the early 1980s (which bought us a holiday cottage in Lympstone). Teaching at local colleges in North London and Gloucester allowed me to expand my knowledge of IT; teaching adults to read and write in North London was an exciting hobby I shared with Judith.

My main hobby was sailing, visiting many ports on the South coast from Brighton to Cornwall and Cherbourg to Brest. We also sailed in areas as disparate as eastern Australia from Brisbane to Sydney and the Bahamas. At the turn of the century a stroke reduced my mobility and I retired to develop small computer databases and websites for the village.

Chris has made a significant contribution to life in the village. He has helped to get flood protection installed and became secretary of the Shop Supporter's Club when the village shop faced closure. For the last sixteen years he has served on the Parish Council, edited the Lympstone Herald and for many years created and maintained the Lympstone Village website.




