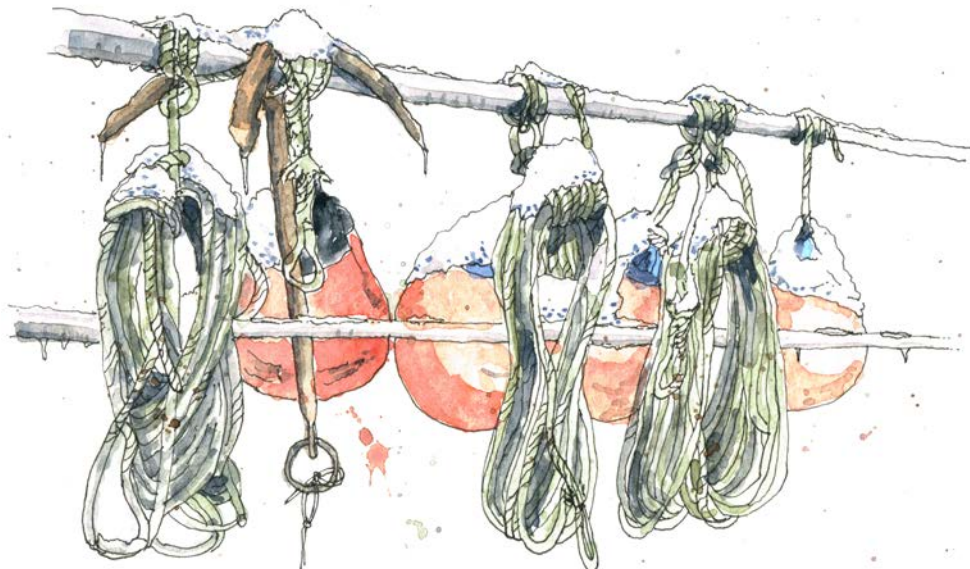

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Councillors have reviewed the appropriate conduct of a meeting. The new format of a meeting to address: a) the length of meetings; and b) public involvement and how this affects the flow of a meeting; will be as follows:

1) The public session is for parishioners to raise matters that are on the meeting agenda or very urgent items. Each participant will have 3 minutes. Other issues should be raised with Councillors or the Clerk via phone or e-mail.

2) Planning – those involved in an application can be invited to speak at the discretion of the Chair of Planning. This will be time dependent and input should be concerning planning considerations.

3) Parish Council meetings are not surgeries for District and County Councillors. Councillor attendance at our meetings is to report back to us. Any concerns or questions should be raised through the Chair at the start of the meeting. Preferably questions should be emailed direct to the County or District Councillors responsible.

4) Timing – we will try to keep the meetings to 90 minutes.

5) Council activity will focus on working groups which will report back as relevant. Councillors feel that this is 'the best of both worlds' as councillors have access to funds and decision making, whilst members of the community are usually best placed to have input to projects and activities. Working

in partnership can produce the best results. Membership of these groups will be open to Parishioners with relevant knowledge, skills and abilities.

6) Agenda papers will be circulated to Councillors prior to the meeting and be on the notice boards and the web site. Only items requiring a vote will be discussed at Parish Council meetings – in other cases Councillors will simply be asked to approve or note actions.

Public Session – Residents asked about the following:

- Were they now restricted to what could be discussed in the open session? - Additional items can be added to the agenda through the Clerk well in advance of a meeting. Cllr Atkins added that any urgent matters can be allocated and discussed under the last item of the agenda.
- The state of Candy's Field and highlighted the fact that the gate at the far bottom corner of the field has still not been replaced.
- The importance of keeping communications open between all the new working groups and ensuring their voice is also heard in the Herald to keep parishioners updated with ongoing projects.
- The cobbled footpath along Church Road. It was highlighted how the cobbles were getting worse and it was now difficult to walk along. The

owner of the path explained that they were in discussions with DCC to repair the path.

S106 Funding – We have been allocated money from EDDC which must be spent on any or all of the following: allotments, amenity open space, sport, formal park provision, children's play or youth play. It was unanimously agreed to spend the money on repairing the Toddler Play Area in Candy's Field and investigating the cost of having different sport flooring lines marked on the MUGA.

The Workshop Update (Land Adj to Heathfield) – The Environmental Agency and Planning Enforcement Officers are currently investigating the sewage outlet that has appeared going into Wotton Brook. Cllr Longhurst has asked members of the public to report any discharge that looks as though it is untreated and polluting the Brook immediately to Environmental Health and if possible, take photographic evidence to send. It is paramount that this is investigated to ensure the discharge is not polluting the Brook where families, children and dogs regular use and play in the water. Casual Vacancy – The Parish Council are pleased to announce that we have successfully filled the two vacancies! We welcomed Mr Hill and Mrs Buttle

who were co-opted on and we all thoroughly look forward to working with them.

Neighbourhood Plan Review – At the NP review Village meeting 24/1/19. there were a total of 104 attendees, and it was a very positive and productive meeting. Focus groups are currently being created and anyone who would be interested in joining a focus group should contact the Clerk. The current focus groups are: Getting Around (Parking, transport and pedestrians), Housing Needs, Environment/Recycling, Social sustainability, Economics sustainability, Flood risk management (LFRG).



The heavenly songs of the 12th century abbess, Hildegard of Bingen, the ‘Sybil of the Rhine’, have captured the public imagination over the past two decades or so. Music written 900 years ago entrances us even today. She described herself as “A feather on the breath of God”, but she was also involved in politics, diplomacy, philosophy and medicine. She is considered to be the founder of scientific natural history in Germany.

Her mesmerising music will be performed by candlelight by the mediaeval ensemble The Telling, who take us back to the middle ages with their intimate concert-theatre presentations, and sing

with “a perfection that is heart-stopping.” Hildegard tells her own extraordinary story, dramatised by Clare Norburn, whose powerful Beethoven’s Quartet Journey enthralled us in 2017. Hildegard herself will be played by the Television and RSC actress Tessa Banham.

If you don’t know Hildegard’s music, or her story, you’re in for a revelation. If you do, you’ll want to rush down to Demelza’s to buy your tickets while there’s still time. Lympstone Entertainments are thrilled to announce the return to the village of the FB Pocket Orchestra, who so delighted our audience when they played for us two years ago.

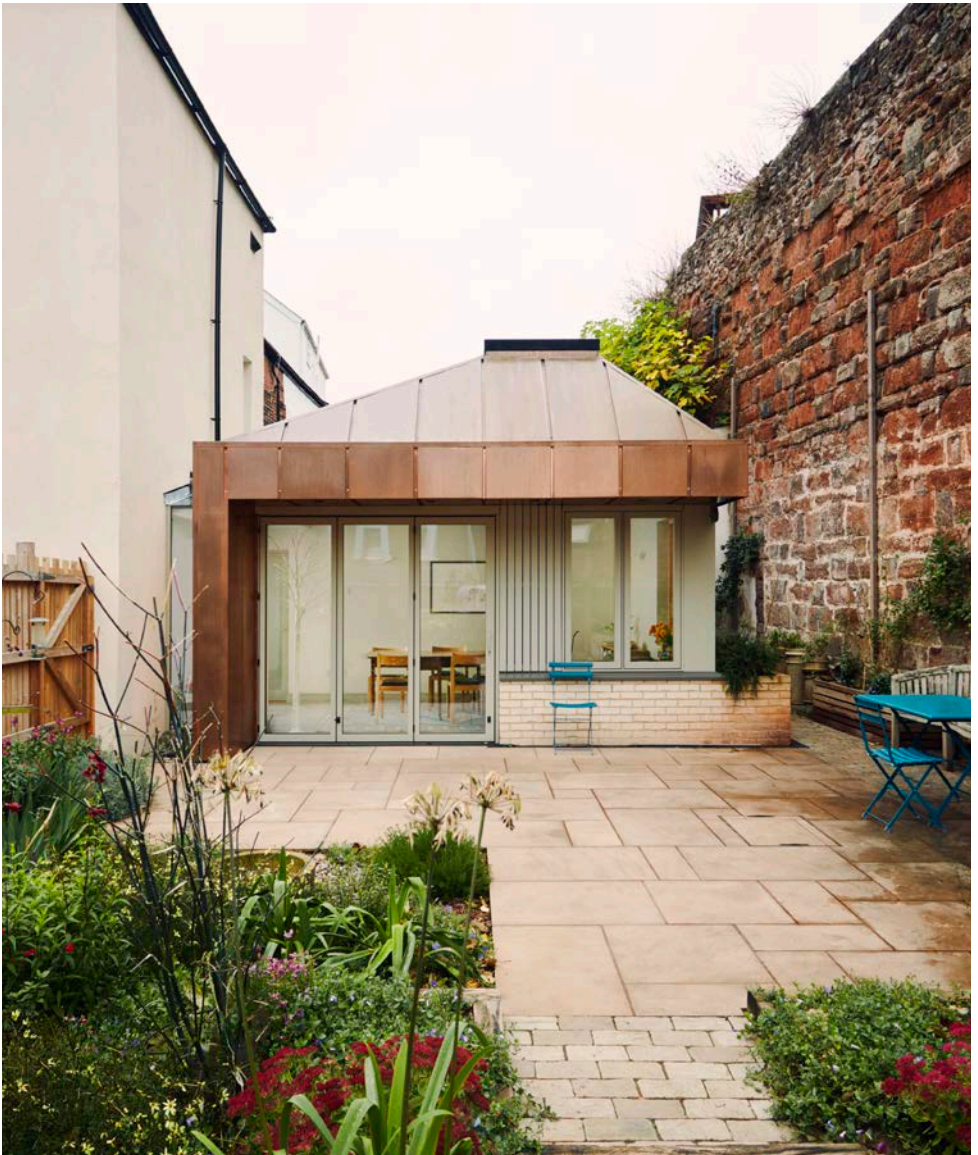

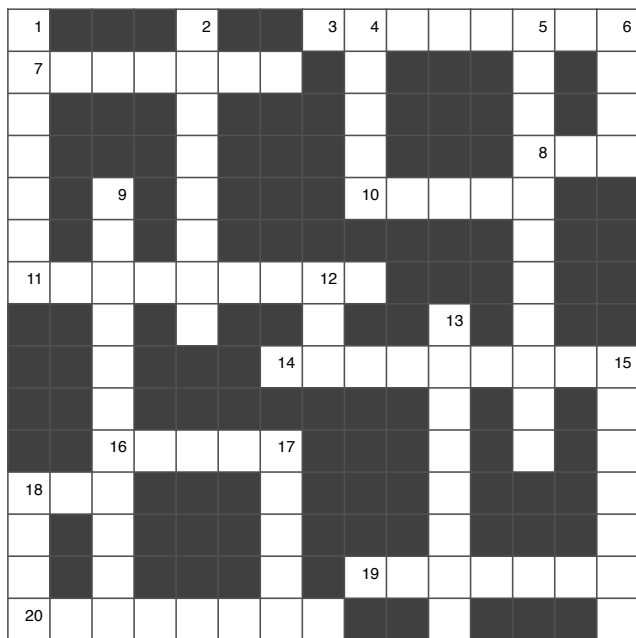

My husband was a keen sailor, and taught sailing and power boating so when we visited friends in Lymptstone, our minds were made up immediately! We bought a derelict house and five months later we moved in; it was still a semi-building site and after 22 years there are still jobs to do.

Lymptstone is a very magical place; over the years the whole family has been involved in many of the clubs and societies and both my children went to the village school. We have met some wonderful people and had a huge amount of fun. For me it is the people who make our village so special. We have found enduring friendships, unfailing kindness, laughter and interesting activity here, and this was most in evidence when my husband died suddenly in 2007.

My perfect day would be to start with a (large!) cooked breakfast, then take my granddaughter Lilly to the beach with her bike or a bucket and spade to build

sandcastles. I would then take a long walk around the village with my camera, and end up in The Globe or The Swan to watch a rugby match. A perfect evening would be supper with friends or family in any of our 4 excellent pubs and then a walk down to the estuary to see the moonlight on the river.

What and who have influenced me most? Certainly my father who had a wicked sense of humour and taught me to be a 'glass half full' person; my grandmother who was the kindest and most generous person I knew, and everyone in Lymptstone - I have learned that the more you contribute to your community, the more you gain.

I feel very privileged to have been elected to the parish council twice and it has been a honour to serve my terms. I hope also that my efforts within fabulous volunteer teams have provided practical solutions to real issues and a few enjoyable community events!by good friends, and our children are having a great time growing up. The amount of clubs and activities for the children is wonderful, and as all parents know there is never a moment to rest.

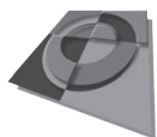
