

# **PARISH COUNCIL NEWS**

At last nights meeting we welcomed a new Parish and District Council for a new Term of Office. Cllr Kathy Rogers was successfully elected as our new Chairman and Cllr David Young as our new Vice Chairman.

**Public Session** - Residents highlighted the following:

- Lympstone Community Hub would like a new Cllr representative.
- Exe Estuary Trail would also like a lead Councillor and invited someone to attend their next meeting.
- Proposed a motion of thanks to Mrs Jenny Clark who had worked hard and done a sterling job of being the previous Chairman to the Council.

**Vacancies** – The Chairman explained that Mr Richard Eastley had expressed an interest in joining the council. He was unanimously supported and coopted on to the Council.

We now have seven Councillors but there are still vacancies. If you are interested in joining our new team, please get in touch for an informal chat about serving your community.

Reports from the Chairman, District Councillors and County Councillors Cllr Rogers explained that a most enjoyable and exciting afternoon had been held with the recent landing of the Merlin helicopter from RNAS Yeovilton on Cliff Field. The Pre-school and Primary School Children attended and were able to go on board and be shown around. Many local people also got to experience this exciting event. A huge thank you went to all involved in the organisation and co-ordination of this from the Royal Navy and Royal Marines.

Cllr Rogers explained that Friends of Gulliford had met and had begun clearing and tidying the burial ground. It had been decided that a wild meadow at the far end of the ground would be kept for the nature that resided there.

County Clir Scott congratulated Clir Rogers on her appointment of Chairman, he also congratulated Cllr Ingham and Cllr Yung on their appointments of District Councillors. He reiterated the sincere thanks to the Royal Navv and Royal Marines for the helicopter landing and the wonderful opportunity it provided for the community. He also reminded all members to support the military wives fund raising event for The Royal Marines Charity. County Cllr Trail was not present but had sent congratulations to the new Parish and District Council.

District Cllr Ingham congratulated the Chair, Vice Chair, new and reappointments of the Parish Council. He added that he and Cllr Yung were delighted to represent both Lympstone and Woodbury Parish. Cllr Ingham explained how the Nurseries that was recently approved at the DMC, all members on the board were impressed with all speakers and the strength of the Parish. He added that the Neighbourhood plan review was important to revisit, and he would be happy to continue to support the group. He also explained how many residents are very concerned about dogs and their mess in the fields and suggested additional signage was needed.

Reports of Lead Councillors: Facilities and Estates - Cllr Atkins agreed with District Cllr Ingham and reported that the dogs were becoming an increasing problem. Cllr Atkins read correspondence received from a resident who had approached someone who did not pick up their dog's mess and ignored her concerns. Therefore, the EDDC dog warden will be contacted to become more involved. In the meantime, Councillors will be policing Candy's field and tackling any dog owners who have their dogs off the lead and any who choose not to clear up after their dog will be reported to EDDC and fined. As tempting as it is, Candy's Field is an area where DOGS MUST BE KEPT ON A LEAD. Other fields are available to walk and exercise your dog. Children play and picnic in Candy's field, it can pose serious health implications to children if they ingest dog faeces and can cause blindness. 



# **GULLIFORD BURIAL GROUND WALL REPAIRS AND HERITAGE LOTTERY**

Work is now underway at the Dissenters Burial Ground to repair the wall which fell down at the end of last year. The two Parish Councils, the Joint Gulliford Burial Ground Committee and the Friends of Gulliford Burial Ground are working together to do its best to accomplish all the works needed to preserve this lovely site into the future.



One of the ways we are doing this is to create a working group to apply to the Heritage Lottery Fund for a grant to preserve this important history site and to raise awareness that it exists.

We've been working hard already and have created a questionnaire which will soon land through your doors which will give us more information about how many people know where it is, have visited it and about general views on how important you feel local history is. 

# PROPOSED FOOTPATH ALTERATIONS

My mother, Mrs Susan Goddard, now in her 90th year, lives in The Mill. The field in front of The Mill, also owned by her, once belonged to the Ware family, who farmed this land.

Currently, there are four footpaths that cross this field: one starts from the ford and runs down the drive a short distance to The Mill before bearing right and into the field which it crosses to the bridge over Watton Brook. This path was opened by my parents primarily to encourage walkers to use it instead of the second path, which begins further down the same drive and very close to The Mill's garden. It too crosses the field to the bridge and a branch crosses the field to what is called Mill Lane. Finally, if you're not already confused, there is a footpath that crosses the field from the bridge to Mill Lane.

When the village was much smaller, few people owned a dog, and cattle were in the field more often than not, this didn't matter. Now, in a very different world, this has had two consequences. Some years ago, the farmer who either kept cattle in the field or cut the the grass for feed, was no longer prepared to do so: the grass had become too polluted with dog excrement to make it usable. Secondly, the frequency with which walkers and their dogs, often running ahead of their owners, found

themselves outside the front door to The Mill has become too frequent to ignore. It's too easy for a 'walker' to enter the immediate vicinity of the house, and when apprehended, to say they thought they were following the footpath.

The plan is as follows: a new route will begin near the ford and close to the shed that was once my father's workshop. It will then run alongside the brook to the bridge that crosses the stream. The second footpath, which crosses the field from the bridge to Mill Lane, will remain the same as it is now. The other routes will then be extinguished.

What does this mean for walkers? The proposed new route that follows Watton Brook downstream to the bridge will, where necessary, be strengthened with hardcore. Where we think trees make passage difficult, they will be removed. The intention is to make the walk along the bank of the brook a pleasing experience. As the route across the field to Mill Lane will remain the same, there is no change. Although the business of maintaining footpaths is the responsibility of Devon County Council, we have not been encouraged by them to think they will fund this change.

You may be wondering what the field is to be used for? Ever since my mother bought The Mill in 1963 and many

centuries prior to that, the field was used for grazing cattle. This was the case until a few years ago, when John Orchard kept cattle there. The intention is, if the field can be kept clear of dog pooh, to let the land again for nothing to a farmer looking for grazing. Their animals will help keep the grass down which will relieve my mother of the expense of cutting it. Prior to any animals being in the field, it will be necessary to make sure that there is fencing to prevent escape and to protect walkers.

Last October, members of the Parish Council kindly came to see the field to understand what was being proposed. With their support in principle, we applied for the diversion of a footpath and the extinguishment of another.
