PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Public Session – A resident expressed his concern of a plant that looked suspiciously familiar to Japanese Knotweed growing in the Brook. Any resident who has land leading to the Brook has a duty to check the Brook for this invasive plant. If the plant is identified, then contact the Environmental Agency immediately to tackle the removal and safe disposal of the plant. Please do not attempt to dispose of it yourself.

Clerks Report – The Internal Auditor concluded ‘...the Council’s financial procedures and controls are sound and effective’ and signed off the accounts for 2018/2019. From the 17th June the accounts will be available for the public to view in their entirety. The Chairman signed the AGAR Annual Audit 2018/19 Governance Statement and Annual Audit 2018/19 Accounting statements in preparation for the External Audit.

The Clerk read out correspondence received from a concerned resident regarding overhanging nettles. It was agreed that the Parish Council would start identifying overgrown nettles and brambles that pose a nuisance to pedestrians and contact the owner. If a letter from the Parish Council is not acted upon then District Cllr Scott reminded the Council that DCC have enforcement officers to back up the Parish Council. Please could all Parishioners check their boundaries for

overhanging nettles and brambles and cut them back. It is important to note that any hedgerows/trees do not have to be cut until the Autumn due to bird nesting season.

The Clerk referred to the damaged door on the traditional red telephone box at Trafalgar Road. The door is beyond repair and it was agreed to purchase a new one to preserve this British icon.

The Clerk read the Annual CIL Report which was agreed and will be displayed on the notice boards and on the website to view. There will also be an upcoming meeting with EDDC Officers to discuss the way forward to spend the CIL money received regarding the toddler play area and activity trial in Candy’s Field.

Reports from the Chairman, East Devon District Councillors and Devon County Councillors – Due to an incident of someone being locked in the village public conveniences late one evening the fire brigade were called to break the lock on the main door. The door lock is currently undergoing repair. Please be aware that should the main door on the toilets lock then this is only a one-way lock. You should always be able to open them from the inside.

The Youth Club had been closed on some occasions this month due to the lack of volunteers to support the running of the club. If you can help and volunteer your time on a Friday evening then please contact the Youth Club

leader, Mrs Susan Briggs or the Clerk of the Council.

County Councillor Scott would like to organise a beach clean-up in Lympstone and continue this for the next 6 to 12 months. The Parish Council fully supported this initiative.

County Cllr Trail explained that the new Toucan crossing on the A376 for the Exe Estuary Trail would be in use by the end of June. He explained the delay had been due to electric connections.

District Cllr Ingham had attended EDDC Annual Council meeting on 22nd May 19 and had been successfully elected as Chairman. Cllr Ingham explained he had appointed a new and independent cabinet to the Council.

Exe Estuary Trail – There were three members of the Exe Estuary Trail Group present and Mrs Davis updated and reported on the progress of the group to date. The group are working incredibly hard with DCC and Network Rail to run the Trail as smoothly as possible through the village. They need funding and are currently investigating different avenues to support their projects.

Getting Around – There was also a report from the Getting Around Group where parking in the village was a main concern. They have begun parking surveys and will be monitoring the use of the roads in and around the Parish. They have spoken with Exeter University and will be getting

students from the university involved in their investigations. All results from their findings will be taken to DCC for future support. The group was agreed to be established formally by the Parish Council.

The Public Conveniences – Cllr Ducker suggested that as the lease from EDDC has now expired, it is necessary to have it in writing that the lease continues as it is not presently clearly documented. Cllr Atkins explained that the lease was taken on by the Parish Council as EDDC were going to decommission the toilets. The Chair explained that the toilets needed updating. Cllr Eastley proposed a site meeting with EDDC Officers to discuss the toilets in their entirety. This was unanimously agreed.


Heritage and Structure – Cllr Rogers reported on Gulliford burial ground. She explained how time consuming it was to rebuild the listed wall, but it is slowly progressing. She also added that there would be an open day later in June for visitors to attend and learn more about the historical background of the burial ground.

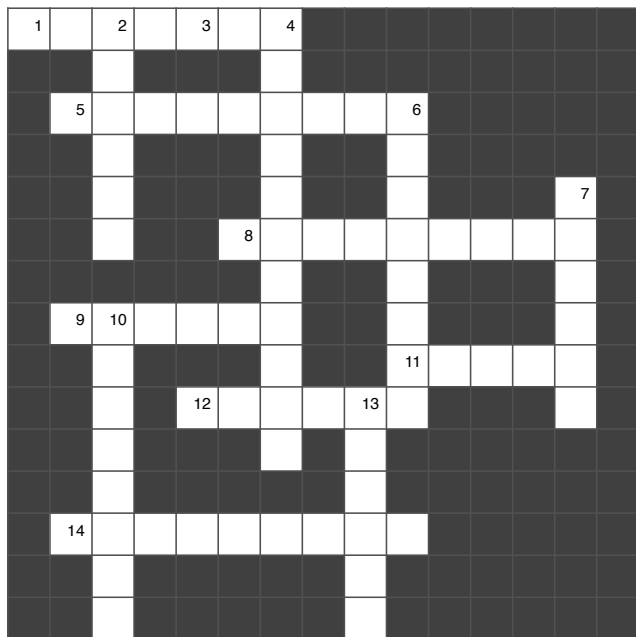

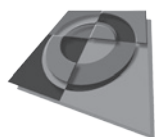
