

### **PARISH COUNCIL NEWS**

The Clerk read the proposal for **HATOC 19/20: The Strand**, No Waiting at Any Time shortening of the limited waiting bay to prevent obstructive parking at the pinch point.

A member of the public explained he felt the parking bays should be kept as they acted as a traffic calming strategy. Cllr Connelly-Cole explained the proposal was to only remove one parking bay and reduce the waiting time. The Parish Council agreed to support the proposal of removing one bay with a condition that the waiting time was enforced by traffic wardens. The Getting Around focus group would be seeking further information from DCC and looking into this. If any members of the public wish to comment, then please visit DCC website to submit your own individual response to the public consultation.

The Parish Council supported the request from the scout group to provide them with some solar lights for outside their hut.

Dog fouling – This has caused quite an upset from members of the Council and Public. Irresponsible dog owners are allowing their dogs to foul without clearing up throughout the entire Parish. It is a dirty and disgusting habit that is putting people off exploring our beautiful village. The Parish Council have agreed to investigate CCTV to tackle irresponsible owners who can be caught, identified and fined.

Reports from the Chairman, East Devon District Councillors and Devon County Councillors –

The Vice Chairman announced that the NP Officer, Mr Twamley, from EDDC will be present at the next PC meeting in September to talk about our current NP Plan and give guidance on a review. The Vice Chairman finished his report with congratulations to our own Cllr Eastley who has successfully been appointed to represent our Parish on DALCs (Devon Association to Local Councils) County Committee for 2019-20.

County Clir Scott reported that he would investigate where the Parish is in the cycle of 3 yearly repainting of yellow lines. He would also investigate further the issue with irresponsible dog owners. He added that soil is due to arrive to complete the levelling of Candy's field. DCC intend to clear streets of weeds on 7th September throughout the village. Cllr Scott added that there is a spotlight review regarding Carers in Devon. DCC are gathering peoples points of views, both positive and negative, and he would like to hear from anyone who is a Carer to share your current situation. Please contact Cllr Scott at richard.scott@devon.gov.uk.

**County Cllr Trail** reported the proposal of eight possible closures of fire stations and invited the Council and Public to share their views. The consultation is open until the second

week of September. Locally, Topsham and Budleigh Salterton are proposed to close and Exmouth could become an evening only station. Please contact Cllr Trail jeff.trail@devon.gov.uk.

District Cllr Jung explained he was now responsible for the environment; recycling and waste, beaches, flood prevention and dog waste. He explained that EDDC were doing well with now up to 60% of waste being recycled. He also added the new green waste bin scheme was a huge success. He explained that EDDC were aiming to be 100% carbon free but had not yet set a target date.

**District Cllr Ingham** explained that EDDC had a budget shortfall and over the next four years, savings of 2.7million pounds had to be made. There would be a review of public toilets, street cleaning, car park charges and amenity services to tackle the issue.

Garden Club; Junior Schedule Grant

Permission to use Candy's, Cliff and Avenue field – The Cllrs agreed to review the use of the public holding

events on the fields and the parking arrangements. Please remember, if you wish to use one of the PCs fields for an event, permission must be sought first from the PC.

VHMC Legal Status – Mr Mildenhall spoke on behalf of the VHMC and explained proposed changes from the VHMC. There would be more information to follow from Mr Mildenhall for the public to read and enquire.

Facilities and Estates - Cllr Atkins



### ONE GIANT LEAP & A FISH SUPPER

The New Film Society Season

This year marks the 50th anniversary of man landing on the Moon. Lympstone Film Society has discovered a brilliant and nail-biting comedy called The Dish, about the telescope located on a remote Australian sheep farm which relayed to the world the live television pictures of man's first steps on the Moon in 1969.

This is just one of several true stories in the new Film Society season. Rudolph Nureyev's sensational leap to the West in the early 60s is told in Ralph Fienne's 2019 film, The White Crow. The Canadian folk artist, Maudie Lewis, wonderfully played by Sally Hawkins, falls in love with a fishmonger in the breathtaking landscape of Newfoundland, and Cornwall's

shantymen, Fisherman's Friends, sing up a storm in a feelgood film that mixes fact and fiction as it tells the story of the rise to fame of the Port Isaac fishermen/ singers. No wonder a fish supper is the popular feature meal open to members of the Film Society this year. And we hope that the Lympstone members of the Exmouth Shantymen will entertain us in the first half.

A very different true story is told by American Animals, the attempt by three teenagers to steal Audubon's Book of American Birds worth \$12 million, one of the most audacious art heists in US history. The real thieves are interviewed alongside the actors who portray them.

Olivia Colman won the Oscar for her performance as Queen Anne in The Favourite, a period drama with lashings of lust, intrigue and deceit that also stars Rachel Weisz and Emma Stone as the Queen's very close friends.

Membership of the Film Society, now in its 13th year, brings 9 Friday night films and 3 Sunday matinees, which this season are Rebel Without a Cause, starring James Dean, The Best Years of Our Lives, and Carol Reed's Odd Man Out, three classic movies selected and introduced by Martin Fisher.

A popular feature is the pre-film drinks and nibbles in the Function Room, which gives members an opportunity to meet and socialise every month.

# LYMPSTONE VILLAGE HALL - CHANGES AFOOT!

Probably most of us use the village hall at sometime - and not just to vote! It's where so many village activities and events take place and it's hard to imagine village life without it. But do you know who owns and manages it and how they do it? How does it get paid for?

Like most village halls, ours is managed by a charity on behalf of the community. The trustees of the charity are mainly nominated by village organisations though there are also some co-opted trustees. The trustees form the hall's management committee.

The hall is financially independent and has no subsidies. Its turnover has grown in recent years and is now in excess of £40,000 a year. Day-to-day operation is managed by volunteers and our part-time premises manager (Miles Freeman).

Why am I telling you all this? Because after nearly 90 years, the trustees have decided it's now right for a change. They want to take advantage of a development in charity law which makes it easier for charities to become incorporated bodies - like most commercial companies. At present our village hall charity is unincorporated - which means that, amongst other

things, the individual trustees have a personal, uncapped financial liability.

This new type of charity is called a Charitable Incorporated Organisation, or CIO for short, To get CIO status we need to set up a new charity and then dissolve our present charity and transfer its assets to the CIO. All these steps will require Charity Commission approvals. The change also gives us the opportunity to equip ourselves with a new governing document - more up to date and fit for purpose than our present one dating back to 1930 (which we cannot change without Charity Commission approval).

This change need not affect the way organisations or individuals use the hall or the rights of village organisations to nominate trustees. But the hall is run on behalf of all of us for the benefit of the village and it's right that everyone should know of what's proposed. We are providing more information and some FAQs on our website (www. lympstonevillagehall.co.uk) and can provide paper copies on request.

There is depth and tone in Sheila's etchings, achieved by the amount of time the plate is exposed to the acid. Her work also has a timeless quality.


