PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Cllr Young took the position of Acting Chair for the meeting. He announced to all members that Cllr Rogers was unable to be present due to an accident and would be away from public duties for 6-12 weeks, all members wished her well and a speedy recovery. He then opened the public session.

Public Session – A member of the public raised a query about the nursery S106 agreement regarding the car park. The owner of the land was present and explained the car park area would have to be, for legal reasons, passed to the PC then immediately transferred to the Church.

Clerk's Report – The Clerk explained that EDDC were happy to support the Parish with a creation of a responsible dog owners' group and train volunteers. If you are interested in being part of a group, please contact the Clerk for more information. EDDC will also support the primary school in heightening awareness amongst the children. The Clerk opened tenders received for a refurbishment of the public toilets and a contractor was agreed. An internal auditor for the PC was also agreed. Full support was given for the return of the Merlin helicopter visit in May for the local schools and children. The removed bin at the top of Candy's Field would currently not be replaced. If you feel

that this bin should be reinstated, then please contact Streetscene at EDDC and quote the ref no: 931422 to express your concerns. The Clerk informed all of DCC's Drainage Maintenance Responsibilities which identified who was responsible for maintaining and clearing drainage systems on and around the highway. Please visit https:// www.devon.gov.uk/roadsandtransport/ factsheet/roads-and-farmers/ to find out more and raise any queries with DCC. There is also a public consultation for 'Public Spaces Protection Orders for dogs, seagulls and anti-social behaviour in central Exmouth and Sidmouth' please visit: www.eastdevon. gov.uk/communityengagement/publicspace-protection-order- consultation to have your say. The public consultation closes on 20th March.

Free Tree Scheme from the Woodland Trust – The PC fully supported the planting of more trees in the Parish. Locations will be identified and depending on the number of trees available will be planted in the Autumn.

Reports from the Chairman, East Devon District Councillors and Devon County Councillors — The Chair was pleased to report that the FOGBG application for a Heritage lottery grant had been successful for the full amount of £66,500! This was for a full

repair of the wall and tombs at Gulliford burial ground. He gave special thanks to Jane Moffat and FOGBG for all their hard work with the application and their continued efforts. There was also a new notice board outside the ground for the public to be kept updated with ongoing activities and information. The Chair reported that due to vandalism, the public toilets had been closed. He thanked the Globe for offering the use of their facilities in the interim. The Chair added that Coronavirus information had been added to all notice boards and the website. The Chair congratulated Cllr Atkins on his long service certificate received from EDDC for his 51 years dedication as a Parish Councillor. He was also pleased to announce that Mr Tyrrell had made it into the national papers for his Brexit bell tower erected and the funds raised for the Royal British Legion. The Chair reminded all that the Happy to Chat benches had been advertised and were going live on 23rd March. The Chair also firmly reminded all present to understand that the Clerk was an employee of the Council. She should not be personally challenged when acting for the PC as her actions were instructed by the Council.

District Cllr Ingham congratulated Cllr Atkins on his long service award. Cllr Ingham announced that EDDC had just received a platinum 'Investors in People' Award. He also reported the

council were investigating how they were governed and changes from the current Cabinet structure may return to a Committee structure. The change potentially would not take place until May 2021. District Cllr Jung congratulated FOGBG on their successful funding bid. Cllr Jung explained that EDDC had set their new budgets and there would be an average rate bill increase of £5 per household. He added that due to the recent weather conditions there were additional high costs involved with troubleshooting immediate issues.

County Cllr Trail also congratulated Cllr Atkins on his long service award. He went on to explain that potholes and highways had their schedules put back due to the recent poor weather conditions. He added that DCC climate change committee information had been sent to the Clerk to distribute and asked that if there were any queries, please direct them to himself or go online. Cllr Trail also added that he would be looking at other options for a road sign for Gulliford Burial Ground.

'HAPPY TO CHAT' BENCHES...

There is clear evidence that loneliness is a major factor today in the UK, not only in the elderly, but equally with younger people as well. It has a major impact on people's physical and mental health. But we can all play our part in changing it

Did you know:

- Young adults are more likely to feel lonely than older age groups, says a study from the Office for National Statistics. The research found that almost 10% of people aged 16 to 24 were "always or often" lonely the highest proportion of any age group.
- In the UK, more than a million older people say they are always, or often feel lonely, according to Age UK. Silverline get over 10,500 calls per week with many callers saying to their volunteers that they are the only people that they are likely to talk to that week.

How did "Happy to Chat" benches start?

A lady called Alison Owen-Jones from Cardiff came up with the simple idea following a walk in a Cardiff park, whilst watching an elderly man for 40 minutes who was sat on a bench in a busy City Centre park, alone.

 Did he want company? Did he want to be alone? Did anyone actually care?

- Wouldn't it be nice if there was a simple way to let people know you're open to a chat, so she came up with the idea of a sign on a bench that would open the avenues for people. She wrote,
- 'Happy to chat bench. Sit here if you don't mind someone stopping to say hello'.
- "All of a sudden, you're not invisible anymore."
- So **YES** you can make a difference, either by sitting and having a chat with someone there, or encouraging someone to sit with you, everyone can win.

LYMPSTONE SAILING CLUB

The 2020 programme for Lympstone Sailing Club has now been published and is available on LSC's website.

This year the club spent a lot of time asking its members, and others in the village, what the club could do differently to get more people on the water - whether in dinghies, cruisers, kayaks or paddleboards - and whether racing or just having fun. The result is a programme for members this year which is designed to appeal to a much broader set of people, while keeping in place the things that people have enjoyed in the past.

For families, this year the club will be running a series of Sunday afternoon BBQs through the summer, with on-thewater treasure hunts and fun events on the water for the kids. The club has the usual full programme of dinghy races on the high tides, but there will be a number of coaching sessions with video feedback to help people new to racing, as well as second starts to some races for people who are nervous on the start line. For cruisers there are various events in company, and the club is running a scheme to allow prospective yacht sailors to have a go, and perhaps meet yacht owners in need of a crew.







VILLAGE DEFIBRILLATORS

There are 3 defibrillators in Lympstone. The first was purchased and wired in on the wall outside Central Shop on The Strand by the Parish Council three years ago. The second was installed on the wall of the Village Hall. A third has recently been installed on the wall to the side of The Saddlers.

All three have been installed so they can be quickly taken down and used, by any member of the public, following the inbuilt instructions. You are required to phone 999 for an ambulance and the operator will give you a code to access the defibrillator if this is needed.
