

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

The PC meeting was held on the 21st June. The date was later than usual due to the Covid19 restrictions.

Clerk's Report - AGAR 2020/21: The Clerk presented all the necessary AGAR certificates and statements which were agreed by the PC. The Clerk would publicise the Notice of Public Rights from 24th June in all noticeboards and on the website. All documents would have to be sent to the external auditor by 30th June. LPC Financial Regulations Policy: The Clerk explained that LPC financial regulations needed updating. She had reviewed the regulations and had previously sent out amendments to all Cllrs. The new financial regulations were agreed and would be added to the website. Friends of Lympstone Open Spaces (FLOS): The Clerk updated all members on the progress of the play area refurbishment. She explained how hard the FLOS group was working to present visuals to the community and raise funds. The Clerk requested additional funding from the PC towards the project and a further £10,000 was kindly allocated and ringfenced by the Council. This now means the PC have a total of £20,000 reserved towards the play areas in Candy's Field. The Chair also proposed that the S106 money from EDDC was allocated in its entirety to the play area refurbishment. This was unanimously

agreed. This is a promising start to the funds necessary but at least a further £50,000 will still be required. The PC would like to say a massive thank you to a local child, Andrew, who has worked tirelessly holding a weekly cake sale and raising £200 towards the play area refurbishment. Thank you, Andrew!

S106 Funding: Lympstone Parish Council and East Devon District Council are working together to improve Candy's Field play area.

Clerk appraisal - The Chair proposed that the Clerk was sent on CILCA training, which was agreed, and a date would be set for a full appraisal.

Reports from the Chairman, East Devon District Councillors and Devon County Councillors -

The Chairman congratulated both Devon County Cllr Trail and Scott on being elected to represent the area for another four years. County Cllr Scott congratulated Cllr Trail on being voted as Chairman for Devon County Council. Cllr Scott reminded all members of LPC that both he and Cllr Trail had asked for a four-year plan of issues

and aspirations for the Parish and they would look into them. Cllr Scott explained that many roads were being reclassified as quieter green roads. He also added that any ideas for road changes in the Parish could go to him directly for further discussion. District Cllr Ingham told LPC that EDDC had a new Chairman, Cllr Ian Morris. He explained that there was currently an investigation into bullying issues at EDDC where officers had received 'added stress through intimidation from senior figures'. Cllr Ingham added that this was totally unacceptable behaviour and would be reporting to LPC again once fully investigated.

Environment: Exe Estuary: Cllr Staddon reported that the Marine Management Organisation was investigating the dredged sludge from the boat store in the Harbour.

Lympstone Primary School Sports Day – On Wednesday 23rd June, the sun shone, and the local primary school held their sports day on Candys Field. It was a glorious day and parents were allowed to attend activities with their child's class during the morning. At lunchtime, there was a socially distanced picnic for the children and their parents. It was a view to behold, there was a real positive, community spirit and a muchneeded boost for everyone.

Gordon Messenger Centre - On the 24th June, the Chair and Clerk of Lympstone Parish Council were invited to a 'meet and greet' with the Commanding Officer, Lt Col Chris Samuel RM, at the new Gordon Messenger Centre at CTCRM. The new building is open to military families both old and new with a variety of facilities on offer including a kitchen, outdoor play area, large event/activity space, meeting and conference rooms and all disabled accessible. There was a friendly, welcoming atmosphere and it is hoped that the new centre provides the necessary access and support to groups, including welfare mental health. Amongst the regular activities planned are coffee mornings, playgroups, cadet meetings and training sessions. It is estimated that more than 50,000 serving personnel and their families will benefit from the centre over the next 30 years, and it will also serve as a focal point for many thousands of veterans and their families.



THE HERALD HISTORY SPOT The Great Lympstone Fire produced by Lympstone History Society

On June 12th 1833 a lighterman by the name of Lyddon, living in Quay Lane, rose early to catch the ebb tide. He lit a fire to cook his breakfast and left his cottage at 3 a.m. with the fire still burning. At about 6 a.m. his thatch caught fire, presumably from sparks from his chimney. The fire quickly spread to other roofs in that densely populated area.

The first fire engine – from Nutwell – did not arrive until after 8 a.m. and was followed shortly by engines from Exmouth and Topsham. By midmorning three more engines arrived from Exeter and by midday the fire was extinguished. By that time most of the houses in Quay Lane had burnt down and the fire had spread to the other side of the Strand as far as the workhouse, at the corner of Underhill where The Haven now stands.

58 houses were destroyed and 248 people were left homeless, with nearly 100 completely destitute. Donations for the relief of the homeless started in the village that afternoon and were followed by collections in Exmouth and Topsham as well as further afield, including a national appeal.

The Quay Lane area was quickly rebuilt, as the Tithe Map of 1839 shows. The rebuilding was carried out in brick and stone with slate or tile roofs since

the traditional combination of cob and thatch was held responsible for the rapid spread of the fire. This is why those common Devon materials are not to be found in this part of the village.



The grant which was applied for and awarded in April, is worth nearly £1,000 and will help the Trust reduce the use and cost of 'town' water. And rainwater is so much better for the plants too!

Trustees Mandy, Carrie & Sue, pictured here unpacking the delivery, along with the other Trustees are so grateful for the support the team at South West Water have given them – especially Holly Corns. The Water Butts have been allocated to plot holders who have a shed or greenhouse without an existing rainwater harvesting system or to run in series with an existing one. All they need is a bit of guttering or connections to get these water butts filling up fast. You may not want the rain but the HAT team do!
