

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

LPC held their monthly public meeting on Monday 1st November in the Committee Room of the Village Hall. A new Chairman and Vice Chairman was voted for the remaining municipal year. Congratulations to Cllr Keith Hill for the position of Chairman and to Cllr Di Beatty for the position of Vice Chairman.

Clerks Report – The Clerk presented LPC policies and a 5-year plan which were all agreed and approved. The 5-year plan would be a fluid, working document to guide focus and clarity for the PC. The PC unanimously supported a grant application from the History Society to continue the sterling work they do to preserve and protect the rich history Lympstone has. Thank you to all the members who continue this work to keep the past alive in our Parish! It was agreed that Cllr Beatty would represent the PC and lay a poppy wreath on Remembrance Sunday. The Clerk shared a letter of thanks to LPC from Andrew Patterson, private secretary to HM The Queen for the thoughtful letter of condolence on the sad passing of The Duke of Edinburgh. LPC now have a casual vacancy position and if anyone would be interested in joining the PC then please write to myself, the Clerk, for more information – we have a lovely team who would be most welcoming and supportive to have you on board!

Reports from EDDC and DCC Cllrs

- EDDC Cllr Jung explained that the recently felled trees on Woodbury Common were part of the forestry work by Devon Clinton Estates. Cllr Beatty added that all up to date information regarding ongoing work on the Common could be found on the Devon Clinton Estates website. DCC Cllr Scott explained that Cllr Trail would be laying a poppy wreath in Exeter, and he would be laying a wreath in Exmouth for the Remembrance services on behalf of Devon County Council.

Lympstone Football Club — Cllr Hill reported that the PC wanted to see the children playing football but as safely as possible on the pitches in Candy's Field. He explained that negotiations were taking place between the PC and FC to resolve outstanding issues.

Community Asset: Methodist Hall – Cllr Atkins reported the new guidelines regarding community asset purchases. He explained the PC would need to remain open and transparent with the public and full support of the community was necessary to successfully bid and secure the building as a community asset. It was agreed that there should be a community working party created to generate and maintain the interest for the Parish. Therefore, if anyone would like more information regarding the

creation and/or joining the new group and support the purchase through a donation, crowdfunding, grant, or other funding events then please contact Cllr Atkins, Tel: 01395 264003 or Email: dga.potters@btinternet.com

Communications: LPC still have a vacancy for a link volunteer to support with the running of the village website, if you are technically minded and could help, please contact me, the Clerk, for further information about this role.

Community: Cllr Payne reported that she had submitted a grant application to the Marines Charity for funding towards the play area in Candy's Field. She should be able to report at the next meeting if her application had been approved or not.

Transport and Parking: Mr Stratford from the Getting Around Group reported on the recent traffic and parking surveys undertaken in the Parish. He added that the Getting Around Group were very much looking forward to working in conjunction with the Active Travel initiative.

CTCRM - It was agreed that Cllr Payne would be the new link Cllr for the PC.

Police Advocate – Cllr Hill explained that he would be attending a seminar in due course to meet senior police officers in the County and discuss local issues.

Gulliford Joint Committee - Cllr Staddon reported that the day at Gulliford Burial Ground had been a huge success and the work completed had transformed the burial She thanked all the volunteers for their ongoing, committed effort and perseverance with the project. ΑII made possible with the secured funding from the Heritage Lottery Fund. This completed work would now preserve the history and artefacts of the site for many future generations to learn about and enjoy. It was agreed that Cllr Beatty and Cllr Staddon would join and represent LPC on the Gulliford Joint Committee with Woodbury PC.

The next PC meeting will be held in the Meeting Room (was Committee Room) at the Village Hall on Monday 6th December at 7.30pm.





THE HERALD HISTORY SPOT

Lympstone Church Organs

produced by Lympstone History Society

Music has long been part of the Church of England service, often produced by a church organ with towering pipes soaring to the ceiling. This was the case in Lympstone. In 1852, the Exeter Flying Post newspaper recorded that 'a new organ has been presented to the parish by Col. Lee of Ebford.' The organ was built by Mr Dicker of Exeter and the organist was Mr Russell. It was hoped that such a generous gift would encourage other members of the gentry to come forward with funds for the church building itself. At the time, the pillars of the north aisle that supported the spread of the roof were thrown many inches out of perpendicular. In addition there was a need to increase the size of the vestry. Previously, for want of seats schoolchildren were forced to huddle into the belfry behind the organ. There was success. In June 1863 there was a report that 'the new church at Lympstone from the design of Mr Ashworth, progresses rapidly.' And that 'Traces of St Christopher were found painted as a mural, behind the north aisle.' By 1864 a new font, pulpit and stained glass windows had been gifted plus many other donations. The organ was at the end of the north aisle with a warming apparatus underneath. In 1886, a bazaar in aid of a fund for the erection of an organ chamber and

vestry was held. The cost was to be £360.

But so to the more recent present. In Mr Lupton & myself listened 2004 to the organ built by Norman Bros & Bread of Norwich being played for the very last time by the gentleman who had been employed to remove the organ to enable increase of the size of the vestry and the addition of toilets. Gone now are the different size pipes, double keyboard, wooden foot pedals and musical knobs with names such as 'Open Diapason' and 'Swell to Pedal'. Tucked away is a stained glass window of an angel playing the organ dedicated to Mr Samuel Sheppard, organist & choirmaster. The church still has its music now accompanied by a modern keyboard. Times move on.

POLLUTION OF WOTTON BROOK

Following the erection of signs relating to pollution of the Wotton Brook a member of the public has asked us to publish the following emails from the Environment Agency to provide further information and advice to other members of the public who are concerned about this issue.

Further to your email regarding [a] complaint about pollution to the Wotton brook in Lympstone from 'The Workshop' I can confirm that a visit has now been made by myself and Environment Officer Doug Parker.

We have checked the brook and there are no signs of pollution from the sewage treatment package. treatment package is a high spec unit which will treat the sewage to a level which it is acceptable to discharge to a watercourse without there being any detrimental environmental impact. We have examined the outlet pipe and there is no sewage fungus in the pipe or other indicators of pollution. package plant is suitable for installation where there is a risk of flooding - it has a non-return valve and the treated water is pumped out rather than gravity fed. As the package plant is not causing any detrimental environmental impact no further action will be taken by the Environment Management Team.

We have been informed that an officer from East Devon District Council's Technical Officer (Private Housing) that he has visited the property/brook and has no issues with the package plant from a nuisance/health aspect.

At the time of our visit two local dog walkers approached us and expressed concern about the detergents being discharged to the watercourse - they pointed out the bubbles in the water when the discharge was pumped out which they thought were evidence of detergent discharge. We were able to alley their concerns by explaining to them that the package plant aerates the effluent and this is the reason for the bubbles - which quickly disappeared upon entry to the water. We also were able to advise them that no solids are discharged. They agreed that there was no evidence of any discharge of any solids.

We understand that there has been consultation with the local authority's building control and that the owner will take the necessary steps to obtain a Building Regulations regularisation certificate for the treatment package plant. East Devon District Council may wish to consider whether they wish to take any steps with regards to any breach of planning consent/any need to apply for retrospective consent if necessary.

I hope this clarifies the situation. Please feel free to forward this email [...] regarding the outcome of the investigation carried out by the Environment Agency.

Further to this I was more concerned over the amount of dog faeces that has been left by irresponsible dog owner along this area of the footpath and the river bank opposite the discharge pipe, if the local children do play in this area of the Brook during the warmer months then this dog mess issue would be a major concern for me if I lived in the local area. I would suggest that you ask your local dog warden about if it was possible to install a CCTV for a week or so, just to cover this stretch of footpath, you might get lucky.



LYMPSTONE GARDEN CLUB

We are having some very warm days for November and I am pleased to report that our large strawberry tree's tiny white bell-shaped flowers are attracting not only masses of bumble bees but also lots of butterflies. I hope they hibernate successfully and increase their numbers next year. I notice frogs and toads are still active. So are the slugs which are a major part of a frog's diet (so eat up please), whereas toads prefer flies, spiders and grubs. Don't forget to clean out bird boxes so that birds can shelter in them over winter. and continue to give us pleasure as they visit bird feeders and baths.

It is now the time of year for major leaf gathering in order to make that wonderful soil improver, leaf mould. It is easy to make a container with four pieces of narrow wood or poles and some chicken wire, or failing that, some bin bags with a few holes near the bottom. Good exercise and something the children can help with as well.

Other jobs in the garden include pruning apple and pear trees (winter pruning for improving vigour and summer pruning for increasing fruiting), applying grease bands to prevent pests, especially earwigs, crawling up the trunks, and checking ties to ensure they are not rubbing; keeping on top of weeds which are still growing strongly (annual weeds

just need hoeing); taking hardwood cuttings, and if you still have time, cleaning pots and seed trays ready for next spring!

We had an excellent talk on 'plants that excite' from Peter Cantrill, a nurseryman and plant enthusiast. His van was full of plants, large and small, and when set out in the Community Room of the village hall, they were a sight to behold. All were for sale and we were delighted that new people to the garden club as well as the regulars were given the opportunity to buy many unusual plants not always readily available. We have invited Peter to come back in September next year when he will have a good collection of herbaceous plants.

We are now looking forward to our next talk on 'Bulbs for Winter, and not just snowdrops' which will be given by Christine Skelmersdale on 18th January 2022.

Now the dark evenings are here, it is a good time to enjoy browsing through seed and plant catalogues, and maybe coming up with new ideas for spring planting.

Meantime, the committee wishes you all a happy and peaceful Christmas.

UV AIR SANITISER INSTALLED AT LYMPSTONE VILLAGE HALL



During the last few months, the village hall has seen a huge number of improvements to its facilities. We have now installed a "state of the art" UV air sanitiser, incorporated into each of the 5 air conditioning units and covering the entire building. It will continually sanitise the air throughout your time in the hall by sucking air up into the units, where it is exposed to intense UV light and cleaned of bacteria, virus, moulds and odours. It will continually sanitise the air throughout your time in the hall. We felt this was a vital improvement, allowing the hall to be a much safer place for the whole community. We are the first village hall in the country to adopt this system.

We have recently installed a projector in the Committee Room, so we now have projectors and electric screens in the Main Hall, Function Room and Committee Room, and we have new energy efficient LED lighting in the Function Room. We hope Herald readers will also like our new sign at the top of School Hill, at the entrance to our car park.

Our sincere thanks to all of the village groups, and the Parish Council, whose donations enabled us to obtain and match EDDC funding for the planned improvements. 
