

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS MARCH 2024

Lympstone Parish Council held their monthly public meeting on Monday 4th March in the Meeting Room.

Clerk's Report - The Clerk was pleased to report that she had fitted new adult and paediatric pads to the defibrillator at the Saddlers Arms and this was now back in service. Hurrah!

Reports from the Chairman, East Devon District Councillors and Devon County

Councillors – The Chairman thanked: DCC Cllrs Scott and Trail for all their efforts organising the roadworks and necessary diversions in and around Lympstone. He thanked them for some funding to assist with maintaining the toilets in Underhill car park. EDDC Cllrs Jung and Ingham, for their guidance and assistance to respond to the latest EDDC plans to remove many green wedges in Lympstone and East Devon. Parish Cllrs, particularly the Chairs of each committee, dedicating many hours of their time to move matters forward. To Cllr Francis who writes and post Facebook entries at any time. Well done to Col. Wheeler and all that assisted the harbour association in clearing the recent cliff slip behind the sailing club. Our Clerk Lucy, who whilst dealing with the complexity of the new finance system, keeps on top of all the

other myriad matters for Cllrs.

District Cllr Ingham explained that he was disappointed with the way EDDC had delivered their proposed green wedge removal process. He understood that this report had been a long time coming (approx 10 years ago) and had enquired how much this had cost. Previous meeting minutes had always recorded that green wedges should remain or even expanded. He would be working with Cllr Jung to retain green wedges and green belts and was attending a meeting to discuss suggested sites of development. One of these was off Marley Road for up to 1,000 houses. He urged all to write objections to EDDC individually and not as a household.

County Cllr Trail thanked the principal of St. Peters school for supporting Highways throughout the disruption of the A376 road works. He explained that recently he had received a lot of abuse on social media, and this was unacceptable. All Cllrs work hard for their community and should not be subjected to abuse. Cllr Trail was more than happy to support LPC with the public toilets with a locality grant.

The Hub building - The Chairman welcome Mr James Barnfield from Hilton and Barnfield architects and Mr

Malcolm Lyons to talk about the Hub building rebuild. The plans had been redesigned to make the building fit for purpose, mainly for youth services and other group opportunities. The user group analysis was very positive about the potential new build. The PC agreed to submit the plans to EDDC and apply for planning permission.

South West Water - Jay Harris, SWW Regional Operations Manager was present and answered the following previously raised questions from Cllrs: Sewer level monitors - 16 monitors installed and only linked to bathing water. Only five were returning data but SWW were looking at improving this. Tankers 13th Nov at The Green - this was a reactive incident where a pump had failed. SWW provide regular maintenance to all pumping stations and would let the PC know of future planned Overflows - EDM monitor in work. Sowden Lane installed in 2023 and not yet validated. Jay explained that SWW were not consultees with planning applications and had to deal with new builds regardless. SWW were currently lobbying government to change this process.

Wotton Brook Water Quality Group

- Clem and Sara Davies were present to report. Sara explained that the water quality monitoring was more than just Wotton Brook, so the group had changed its name to Lympstone Water Quality Group (LWQG). She stated the aims of the group; 1. Assess the current water quality situation within the Wotton catchment and Brook Lympstone Parish boundaries: Sources pathways of pollution in the Brook and Exe Estuary, Chemical and ecological status of the Wotton Brook, Threats and opportunities. 2. Develop a strategy to protect and improve the water quality: In the short term, raising awareness and influencing decisions, and reporting and investigating pollution incidents. For the longer term, working with partners to develop an overall strategy and secure funding. Sara summarised the progress to date and future planned actions. Cllr Staddon thanked both Clem and Sara for setting up the group and all their hard work so far. The PC agreed to adopt the group as a working party.

Assets and amenities committee – Cllr Linfoot reported that the trees along the Avenue had been pollarded and the wood chippings had been spread along the entrance to Avenue field to allow walkers a firmer ground to walk over.

Environment committee – Cllr Staddon explained that on the 6th February three members of the Parish Council attended the Exe Estuary Management Partnership forum. The

topic for this forum was Water Quality. The EA, SWW, Giles Bristow CEO of 'Surfers Against Sewage' (SAS) and 'End Sewage Convoys and Poolution in Exmouth' (ESCAPE) all spoke at the forum.

Planning and Transport committee – Cllr Linfoot reported that the committee met on 26th Feb regarding EDDC proposed removal of Green wedges. 77% across East Devon and 81% in Lympstone. The committee had drafted an objection, agreed by the PC and sent to EDDC strategic planning committee, unfortunately the letter was not referred to at the meeting. The committee had drafted a letter to MPs, proposed MP candidates, EDDC strategic planning members and every PC in East Devon inviting them to read the letter and raise awareness of proposals. The PC approved the letter to be sent.

Community committee – Cllr Staddon reported that the committee had met on the 20th Feb. Agenda items included: Community payback scheme, D-Day evening celebrations on Front Meadow with music from the Lympstone Ladies Choir, remaining mugs from both the Jubilee and Coronation to be sold off in the next few months, plans for the community party in Candys Field inc. music from Lympstone Academy Band and possibly three other bands, a bar,

food, and some fun with local record attempts.

The next PC meeting and the Annual Parish Meeting will be held on Monday 8th April 2024, the Annual Parish Council meeting will be held on Monday 13th May 2024 in the Meeting Room, Lympstone Village Hall.

FRIENDS OF THE CHURCH AGM

The Annual General Meeting of the Friends of Lympstone Parish Church will be held on Sunday 21st April, straight after morning service, starting at about 11 – 11.15am.

The Friends have a committee, but no membership, and so if you are friendly you are invited.

The sole aim of the Friends is to ensure that the oldest and most historic building in the village stays in good repair. As a group we play no part in either the day-to-day running of the church or of paying any of its recurrent expenses.

We hold village events such as the annual Cricket Match, the Curry Lunch, and a varied programme of talks. We also run a Monthly Lottery with a prize of £50 per month, with a volunteer force of village ticket sellers who will soon be knocking on your door. (Be kind to them, and generous...)

Over the past four decades nearly 65,000 has been raised to pay for re-roofing the church, repairing the weathercock, conserving monuments, installing grids to protect the church's superb array of Victorian stained glass windows, repairing stonework on the 15th century tower and repointing

walls. Many smaller projects have been completed. Every 5 years an architectural inspection identifies repairs that need undertaking, and it is then that the Friends are able to help.

Lympstone has been unfailingly generous over the years, and we would like to welcome you to our AGM, and tell you of our activities over the past year.

Our next event is the Annual Cricket Match, Lympstone v St Peter's, which is being held on the beautiful ground of St Peter's School, earlier than usual, on Thursday 16th May at 6pm. A Barbecue and a Bar will help to make it a very enjoyable summer evening..

WILD ABOUT LYMPSTONE

We have been beavering away in the background on various projects, one of which is the 1000 plant giveaway in May. We are also playing a small part in the Garden Festival in June when you will be able to come and find us in the Telfer's garden at Ellenthorpe, a wonderful example of gardening for wildlife.

The seeds have been planted and the volunteers will soon be potting them up ready for the plant giveaway. These wild native plants are all perennials or self-seeding annuals, and have been selected to attract a wide range of pollinating insects. Members of Wild About Lympstone will be leading some wildlife walks on the day, so come along and find out what's growing in the village, and what wildlife it attracts and supports.

Working with others in the community, the church is preparing a plan for management and maintenance of the churchyard to make it more friendly to the environment. As well as joining in with "No Mow May" this year, the plan will include encouragement of wildflowers, insects and bugs. NEW 'WATER GUARDIANS' RECEIVE TRAINING

Following an amazing response to a call for help in last month's Herald. 20 Lympstone residents received training in water quality monitoring on 14th March. The new 'water guardians' are a vital part of the community-led project to assess, protect and improve the water quality in the Wotton Brook and Exe Estuary. The training participants included a great mix of people from our community, with two important things in common - concern about the state of our natural waters and motivation to improve them. The youngest was 10-year-old Mylo, who inspired us all and was a reminder of why we were there - to improve our environment for future generations.



Mylo said:

"I wanted to get involved because I knew that the brook was polluted and I wanted to help. I don't think [pollution] is good because it can hurt the animals that live there and the dogs that paddle in it, but we can change it and so I was pleased to do the training"

The training was provided by Westcountry Rivers Trust. a kev partner in our project and a trailblazer in developing citizen science water monitoring - using a network of volunteers across the South West (currently 1,500 and growing). mix included а of presentation, discussion about our local issues and plans, and practical demonstration of the monitoring techniques by the Brook.

The Lympstone Water Guardians will be involved in a range of activities - with people selecting those that suit their interests and time availability – including: raising awareness, observing the Brook and Estuary, conducting routine monitoring of the Brook (as demonstrated in the training), investigating sources of pollution and incidents, and conducting monitoring of aquatic invertebrates.



This is all part of a wider project plan, which includes working in partnership with other Lympstone groups (Lympstone Flood Resilience Group, Wild About Lympstone, Lympstone Fishery & Harbour Association, and Lympstone Primary School), residents, landowners, government organisations, and others. The first meeting of the Project Steering Group was held on 21st March, and both the Environment Agency and South West Water have committed to working collaboratively

with us to improve the water quality.



LYMPSTONE LADIES VILLAGE CHOIR

On 24th February we enjoyed taking part in the Village Concert. The WE that I refer to are the Lympstone Ladies Village Choir.

A year ago following the 2023 concert, I had an idea to get a few ladies together to prepare for, and participate in the 2024 concert. Little did I know that over 40 ladies would come forward and, after joining forces with Wendy Reynolds, our choir leader, and Fiona Archer, our ladies village choir was born.

In September 2023 we commenced our weekly sessions. Our chosen venue was the Sailing Club. This choice has had wonderful benefits with the seascape providing inspiration, but, it also has drawbacks. We tested the water on the general public at Christmas with a few casual sing-alongs where we received a lot of encouragement. So, for those of you in the audience, we hope you enjoyed our renditions from the well known, My Fair Lady and Joseph and the Amazing Technicolour Dreamcoat musicals.

We thank the audience for their participation and rousing finale —in fact, we now feel, with so many good voices, that we have to widen our brief. The Ladies choir is now going to be 'rebranded ' as The Lympstone Singers and will be open to any village women or men who want to join... no experience necessary! We are delighted that Martyn Esua has agreed to join us on the piano.

Future Plans.

We are taking a break until May when we start again to rehearse for the 80th anniversary of the D-Day landings on the evening of Thursday 6th June. We plan to gather, with picnics, under the oak tree opposite the church, where we will remember, in song, and possibly

verse, that momentous event.

Rehearsals will be at 5.30 - 7 p.m. on Thursdays throughout May. The 16th May will be from 4 - 5.300 p.m. as the Lympstone ladies meet at 7.00 p.m. on that day.
