## Description:

This is a risk assessment of the visitor routes at The Green split in to high, medium and low-level use.

The use of the field takes account of different levels of use and types of activity, reflecting the numbers of people that use the area and the time that they spend in that area. The risk assessment follows the guiding principles of the 'managing visitor safety in the countryside; principles & practice' guidance produced by the Visitor Safety in the Countryside Group and is relevant for visitors to site and contractors. Any specific activities carried out on the site are covered through other risk assessments. The Green is a paved area situated on The Strand in the centre of the village. It has two benches and an adjacent crossing from the Highway to the estuary. It is used as a resting place for pedestrians and cyclists passing by. Alongside the area is a locked post to prevent vehicular access to the estuary.

## **Beach hazards**

LPC does not take responsibility for hazards at sea, this role is taken on by other organisations such as Heritage England, the Harbour Board and Exe Estuary Partnership Management. The estuary is not manned.

## **Severity of the hazard:**

How serious are the consequences likely to be? Extreme (fatality) / Serious (major injury or serious ill health) / Moderate (minor injury)

## **Likelihood of the event:**

How likely is it that the event will occur? Remote / Possible / Likely

## **Adequacy of controls:**

Are existing precautions adequate? Good (most precautions in place) / Fair (some deficiencies) / Weak (serious deficiencies)
